 REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS:

FOCUS: God's commandments are written in our hearts. Today we are challenged to love God with our entire being and our neighbor as ourselves. On the face of it, these are difficult commandments to live out day after day, but Moses reminds us that they are written in our hearts. Our task is to listen to God's word and carry it out at each moment, in each situation we face.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, Moses calls on the people to heed the voice of God written in their hearts. The second reading reminds us of Christ Jesus as *the image of the invisible God*, through whom all things were created and who made *peace by the blood of his cross*. In the Gospel, Jesus points to the Good Samaritan, with his unselfish works of mercy, as an example of a good neighbor.

Be constantly vigilant anytime
your children are near water

Drowning takes only a few seconds, especially when children have easy access to a body of water. Fact of Life:

Billions Wasted on Immoral Stem Cell Research in California

Again, our Catholic Faith has it right. The immoral use of embryonic stem cells has always been rejected by Catholic Church teaching. The Catholic Church opposes research involving human embryonic stem cells, which require the destruction of the human embryo during their isolation. In contrast, the Church has championed adult stem cell research, which does not involve human embryonic stem cells. The California Institute for Regenerative Medicine, CIRM, created in 2004 received 3 billion in bond funding from voters. Fifteen years later, they have produced no success, and the money has dried up. This money was promoted as practically a sure thing, proponents, to be by the backers, the miracle to cure a whole slew of diseases including Parkinson's and Alzheimers. Our church teaches that an immoral act can never be accepted for the result of a good. The destruction of an innocent human being can never be acceptable.
