

<u>FOCUS</u>: God is merciful to the faithful. Faithfulness to God is blessed with grace and mercy. Jesus interceded for us, as Abraham did for **Sodom, and salvation is ours through His cross. Righteous living, which is adhering to God's commands and caring to one another, is how we embrace our salvation. We encourage all to read and reflect on the Biblical passages that will be proclaimed at <u>Masses</u> next week

First Reading -- Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity! (Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23).

Psalm -- If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts (Psalm 90).

Second Reading -- You too will appear with Christ your life in glory (Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11).

Gospel -- For though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions (Luke 12:13-21).



Saint Anastasia was born in 281 A.D. and became a perfect symbol of peace, humanity, and solidarity. Her Feast Day is December 25th. She is a symbol of dialogue and collaboration. In her spirit, and in the spirit of love, we welcome all to the Catholic Community of St. Anastasia Catholic Church.

The Magnificat, taken from Luke's Gospel (1:46-55), is the Blessed Virgin Mary's hymn of praise to the Lord. It is also known as the Canticle of Mary in the Liturgy of the Hours, a special collection of scripture readings, psalms, and hymns that constitute what is known as the prayer of the church. (Priests and other religious are required to pray sections from the Liturgy of the Hours each day).

The *Magnificat* provides great material for meditation on the Visitation, the second Joyful Mystery of the Rosary, pictured below. When the angel Gabriel informs Mary that she is to be the Mother of God, he also tells her of her relative Elizabeth's pregnancy with John the Baptist.

After Mary gives her famous consent to becoming the Mother of God, — "Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it done to me according to thy word" (Luke 1:38) — she goes "with haste" (1:39) to help Elizabeth, who is delighted to see her. Our Lady then expresses her joy in the Magnificat.



# The Magnificat (Canticle of Mary)

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for He has looked with favor on His lowly servant.

From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me , and Holy is His name.

He has mercy on those who fear Him in every generation.

He has shown the strength of His arm, He has scattered the proud in their conceit.

He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly.

He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich He has sent away empty.

He has come to the help of His servant Israel for He has remembered His promise of mercy, the promise He made to our fathers, to Abraham and His children for ever. Amen.

Ask about any problems they may have handled previously, or how they would handle a complaint from a child. # French Court Orders Death to a Severely Disabled Man

The providing of food and hydration, even through a feeding tube, is considered NOT EXTRAORDINARY medical intervention, To remove these basic needs to any human is a grave moral evil.



"The highest civil court in France has ordered that food and water may be removed from a severely disabled man...his parents have exhausted their years-long fight to keep their son alive. However, the parents said that they will press murder charges if their son is removed from food and hydration. 'In any other context, killing by starvation is considered a crime against humanity, yet in France as in the United States we routinely impose this type of tortuous death on disabled individuals,' said Alexandra Snyder, executive director of Life Legal, a group that advocates for the vulnerable.

"Pope Francis addressed this case during a Regina Coeli address in 2018, asking for prayers for 'people such as Lambert, 'who live at times for a long period, in a serious state of illness, medically assisted for their basic needs. Every offense or wound against the body of our neighbor is an outrage to God the Creator. In the flea of these people we find the flesh of Christ."
