EOCUS: God's love is like a raging fire! In today's Gospel, Jesus outlines many of the ways in which his coming into the world will cause division, and not peace. He comes to set the earth on fire — not to destroy it, but to emblaze it with the fullness of God's love for us. The divisiveness arises not from Jesus himself, but from peoples' response to him: choosing either to build up that fire, or to tamp it down. Let us be those who feed the fire of the kingdom, not extinguish it.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: Jeremiah is imprisoned under the authority of King Zedekiah because the people are upset by his words. But a court official convinces the king to release him. The writer of Hebrews challenges the community to *rid [themselves] of every burden and sin* and to keep their *eyes fixed on Jesus*. In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples he has come not to establish peace, but division.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The anointing of the sick is administered to bring spiritual and even physical strength during an illness, especially near the time of death. A family member SHOULD NOT delay in calling a priest to administer this sacrament. The Anointing of the Sick can only be administered while the person is alive. It is most likely one of the last sacraments one will receive. A sacrament is an outward sign established by Jesus Christ to confer inward grace. In more basic terms, it is a rite **that is performed to convey God's grace to the recipient, through the power of the** Holy Spirit. **The Sacrament's Institution:** Like all the sacraments, holy anointing was instituted by Jesus Christ during his earthly ministry.

The *Catechism* explains, "This sacred anointing of the sick was instituted by Christ our Lord as a true and proper sacrament of the New Testament. It is alluded to indeed by Mark, but is recommended to the faithful and promulgated by James the apostle and brother of the Lord" (CCC 1511; Mark 6:13; Jas. 5:14-15). The

anointing of the sick conveys several graces and imparts

gifts of strengthening in the Holy Spirit against anxiety, discouragement, and temptation, and conveys peace and fortitude (CCC 1520). These graces flow from the atoning **death of Jesus Christ, for "this was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah, 'He took our infirmities and bore our diseases'" (Matt. 8:17).**

Many victims of abuse don't report the abuse right away, if ever. Predators groom their victims, and part of this process is designed to make the victim feel like they should trust their predator, even more so than their own parents. Many victims also have a fear that their **parents or trusted adults won't believe them, or that they will get in** trouble for what happened — sometimes an abuser will threaten a **child, using the child's fear to buy the child's silence. It's important** for parents to teach their children to talk with their parents about what is happening to them, what might be frightening them, and that they will be supported in disclosing.
