We encourage all to read and reflect on the Biblical passages that will be proclaimed at <u>Masses next week</u>

First Reading -- Your ancestors waited in faith and courage for God's promised summons (Wisdom 18:6-9).

Psalm -- Blessed the people the Lord has chosen to be his own (Psalm 33).

Second Reading -- By faith Abraham sojourned in the promised land (Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19 [1-2, 8-12]). Gospel -- You do not know the day nor the hour when the Son of Man will appear (Luke 12:32-48 [35-40]). Saint Anastasia was born in 281 A.D. and became a perfect symbol of peace, humanity, and solidarity. Her Feast Day is December 25th. She is a symbol of dialogue and collaboration. In her spirit, and in the spirit of love, we welcome all to the Catholic Community of St. Anastasia Catholic Church.

The Angelus (<u>/'ændʒələs/</u>; <u>Latin</u> for "angel") is Catholic devotion commemorating the Incarnation. As with many Catholic prayers, the name *Angelus* is derived from its incipit—the first few words of the text: Angelus Domini nuntiavit Mariæ ("The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary"). The devotion is practiced by reciting as versicle and response three Biblical verses narrating the mystery, alternating with the prayer "Hail Mary". The Angelus exemplifies a species of prayers called the "prayer of the devotee". The devotion was traditionally recited in Roman Catholic churches, convents, and monasteries three times daily: 06:00, 12:00 and 18:00 (many churches still follow the devotion, and some practice it at home).^[2] The devotion is also observed by a few Anglican and Lutheran Protestants. The Angelus is usually accompanied by the ringing of the Angelus bell, which is a call to prayer and to spread goodwill to everyone. The angel referred to in the prayer is Gabriel, a messenger of God who revealed to the Virgin Mary that she would conceive a child to be born the Son of God (Luke 1:26-38).

The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary. R. And she conceived of the Holy Spirit. (Hail Mary ...) Behold the handmaid of the Lord. R. Be it done unto me according to thy word. (Hail Mary ...) And the Word was made flesh. R. And dwelt among us. (Hail Mary ...)

> Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: Pour forth, we beseech thee, O Lord, thy grace into our hearts; that, we to whom the incarnation of Christ, thy Son, was made known by the message of an angel, may by his passion and cross, be brought to the glory of his resurrection, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Mission Co-Op Collection takes place next weekend, August 10/11th, 2019

On the weekend of August 10th and 11th, Most Rev. Amal Raj, Bishop of Ootacamund, India will be in our parish to make mission appeal for his diocese. This diocese was established in 1955 in the mountainous area of Tamil Nadu State in India by Pope Pious XII. It has a Catholic population of c.85,000 which would be 5% of the total population.

The diocese of Ootacamund spreads out in three districts namely Nilgiris, part of Erode and part of Coimbatore districts. About 150 priests and 415 religious serve in about 70 parishes and 22 high schools of this diocese. About two thirds of the faithful of the diocese of Ootacamund are mostly daily wages laborers and farmers. Apart from people with different cultures the diocese is endowed with different aboriginal tribes both in Nilgiris and Erode districts. The amount received from the mission appeals will be spent for the missionary works for the tribal people and for the education of their children.
