

THIS WEEK: SATURDAY, OCTOBER 12th/ SUNDAY, OCTOBER 13th, 2019 28th Sunday In Ordinary Time Reflections on Today's Readings:

<u>EOCUS</u>: The word of God is powerful enough to cleanse us of sickness and sin. The first reading and the Gospel show us miraculous cures from the terrible disease of leprosy. Through faith and trust, those who were sick listened to and followed the direction of their healers and regained their lives and standing in the community. Nothing is beyond God's capabilities, including forgiving our most egregious sins.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, Naaman is cured of his leprosy after following the prophet Elisha's instructions to plunge into the Jordan River seven times. In his Letter to Timothy, Paul notes that while he may be in chains, the word of God is not. All who are faithful to Christ will obtain salvation in him. In the Gospel, Jesus cleanses 10 lepers but only one of them — a Samaritan — returns to give glory and thanks to God.

Saint Anastasia was born in 281 A.D. and became a perfect symbol of peace, humanity, and solidarity. Her Feast Day is December 25th. She is a symbol of dialogue and collaboration. In her spirit, and in the spirit of love, we welcome all to the Catholic Community of St. Anastasia Catholic Church.

WHY EXTRAORDIINARY MISSIONARY MONTH? Pope Francis has set October 2019 as an Extraordinary Mission Month to foster greater awareness of "*mission ad gentes*" (mission to all peoples) and to animate the missionary transformation of Church life and pastoral activity. The date was chosen in commemoration of the 100th anniversary of Pope Benedict XV's 1919 Apostolic Letter on mission, *Maximum Illud*.

THE LOGO AND ITS MEANING: The primary colors of the Cross refer to the five continents: RED for America, GREEN for Africa, WHITE for Europe, YELLOW for Asia and BLUE for Oceania. RED recalls the blood of American martyrs, seeds of new life in the Christian faith. GREEN is the color of life and **symbolizes growth, fertility, youth and vitality. It's also the color of** HOPE, one of the three theological virtues. WHITE is the symbol of joy, the beginning of a new life in Christ: this is the challenging facing old Europe, so that it can recover the evangelization force that was generated thanks to so many churches and saints. YELLOW is the color of light, which is nourished by light invoking the true Light. BLUE is the color that symbolizes the water of life that quenches our thirst and restores us along the path to God. It is the color of the sky, a sign of God dwells with us.

Did You Know? The Archdiocese is participating in an Independent Compensation Program for Victim-Survivors of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priests

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles, along with five other dioceses in California, is participating in an independent program to offer persons who were victims of abuse as minors by diocesan priests, access to compensation as well as access to counseling services if they chose. Those harmed many years ago and barred from filing lawsuits because of civil statutes of limitations will be eligible to make claims under the Independent Compensation Program for Victim-Survivors of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priests. The Archdiocese's participation in the program is part of a long-standing commitment to supporting and compensating victims of abuse, the protection of children and the vulnerable, and the prevention of abuse and misconduct in Catholic parishes, schools and ministries. Nationally recognized mediators and private compensation program administrators, Kenneth R. Feinberg and Camille S. Biros will administer the program. Funding for the program in our Archdiocese will come from self-insured reserves, monies set aside for this purpose. We pray that this new program might provide another avenue toward healing and hope. 
