REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS:

FOCUS: Perseverance in prayer and fidelity to God's ways lead us to the kingdom. Endurance runners need a great deal of perseverance. They cannot expend all their energy at the beginning or they won't be able to complete the race. Nor can they run the race without the proper training, fuel and clear direction as to the route. We, too, need a tremendous amount of perseverance to run a race of good faith. Prepared by sacraments, fueled by grace and headed toward Jesus, we can reach the kingdom.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, Moses needs help in keeping his hands raised so that Joshua will be victorious. Saint Paul reminds Timothy to remain faithful to what he has learned. In the Gospel, Jesus uses the parable of the persistent widow to remind the disciples to *pray always without becoming weary*.

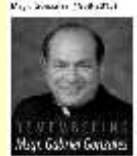

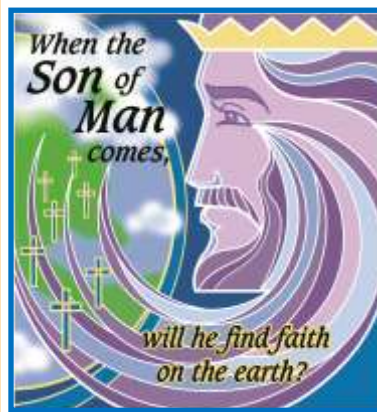

PRAY ALWAYS? HOW? Today we have two examples that can help us reflect on what it means to pray always. The first is Moses, holding his arms up so that the Israelites will have the better of the battle. This is a common posture for prayer in the ancient world, and the Bible is full of references to **one’s lifting up hands (and arms) in prayer.** The second example is from the parable Jesus uses to demonstrate the principle of praying always: the widow who persistently **pestered a judge from whom she demanded justice.** Moses’s prayer is a continuous movement extended over a period of **time; the widow’s petition is repeated at frequent intervals over time.** The Church’s rich tradition of prayer sets before us examples of both kinds of prayer.

Know the signs of denial

Denial is a commonly used defense mechanism for abuse victims. Because they want to believe that things will go back to normal, victims often feel trapped into just allowing the situation to play out. Fear of change can be overwhelming, especially if the victim has been manipulated by his or her abuser. **Victims may also struggle with accepting what’s happening because they know their abuser closely, as a family member or friend.** It’s important to recognize the signs of denial and how to break through those barriers that can keep a victim from true healing. Everybody needs a mom. Jesus knew

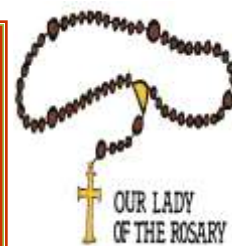
