

THIS WEEK: SATURDAY, OCTOBER 26TH/ SUNDAY, OCTOBER 27TH, 2019 30TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS:

EOCUS: Relationship with the Lord requires us to recognize our dependence on Him. While pride is the root of much sin, humility is the soil in which a life of virtue can grow. The more we recognize our need for God and His mercy, the more we can open ourselves up to the grace He wishes to pour out on us. It is when we think ourselves independent of God that we close ourselves off to His saving mercy and grace.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: Sirach says that the Lord is a God of justice who is not partial, but does hear the cries and prayers of the most vulnerable. Saint Paul writes that he has kept the faith and looks forward to the crown of righteousness, noting that it was the Lord who rescued him from evil. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the Pharisee and tax collector who go to the Temple to pray, noting the justification of the tax collector due to his humility.

May we cherish and promote both!




