SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT
 REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS:

FOCUS: A holy encounter with God calls us to act on our faith. When Peter witnesses the transfiguration of Jesus, and the appearance of Moses and Elijah, his first instinct is to “freeze that moment,” by providing tents for the three of them. But that encounter, like any encounter with God’s majesty and providence, is not meant to be frozen or hidden in a tent. It is meant to move us forward in, and to act upon, our faith.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: Abram is sent by God to a new land, so that from him, God will create a new nation. In the second reading, Timothy is encouraged to bear his share of the hardship in living and proclaiming the Gospel. In the Gospel, Jesus takes Peter, James and John up a mountain where He is *transfigured before them*.

Lent 2020 – The Catholic Community around the world follows

these general regulations during Lent: **ABSTINENCE** – Refrain from the consumption of meat. This penitential practice is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and the Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence. Pastors and parents are encouraged to see that children who are not bound by the obligation to fast and abstain are led to appreciate an authentic sense of penance.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE – Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18-59 years (inclusive). On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition. **Giving up something for Lent fosters self-discipline and tempers our desires.** It is a form of fasting. It is a form of penance. It promotes spiritual growth. If you're giving up something for Lent, that's great. Also consider doing something positive to bolster your spiritual life and make the world a better place. Look for ways that you can increase your knowledge of your faith, strengthen your spiritual life or perform special acts of mercy and kindness at home, at work, in your parish or in your community. **Strengthen your faith!**

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT
What to give up for Lent in 2020
(that isn't chocolate)?

Negativity - Giving up negativity, whether complaining about a situation or gossiping about someone else, is a wholesome way to reset your tendencies during Lent. Studies show that it may be harder to kick this habit than it seems. Most people complain once a minute during a typical conversation. There are dangerous health implications as well for complaining because it increases your body's level of the stress hormone cortisol. This impairs your immune system and makes you more susceptible to heart disease, among other ailments.

"We all know it usually is easier or more comfortable to notice and condemn the defects and sins of others rather than seeing our own with that kind of clarity. ... If, by the end of Lent, we are able to correct this a bit and not go around always criticizing others behind their backs, I assure you the celebration of Jesus' resurrection will be more beautiful." — Pope Francis

Spending money—This resolution for Lent goes along perfectly with the sacrificial spirit of the season leading up to Easter. Catholic tradition holds that Lent is not only about prayer and fasting, but also about almsgiving. "Almsgiving is really just another name for charitable giving. Alms comes from a word that means pity, while charity comes from the Latin word 'caritas', that means love. That's why some translations of 1 Corinthians 13:13 it reads 'faith, hope, and charity,'" wrote Charles Johnston on a Catholic blog. There are many options for this, whether it is simply nixing an afternoon coffee habit or setting a strict no-spending budget for the six weeks of Lent. By giving up one area of spending, more money can be freed up to practice charitable giving, if you choose.



Winter Cold and Flu Season

You are reminded to use common sense in your participation at Mass and the reception of Holy Communion from the chalice during the annual cold and flu season. If you are feeling ill or think you may have been exposed to a virus, you should refrain from partaking of the Blood of Christ from the Communal Chalice. In the same way, you should refrain from offering your hand to others at the sign of peace (or during the Lord's prayer). A smile and a heartfelt, "Peace be with you," should suffice. Likewise, if you are not comfortable sharing the sign of peace or receiving Holy Communion from the communal chalice for fear of infection, you should feel no pressure to do so. All of us must be aware of such sensitive matters in the intimate life of the Christian community and we should expect that some will refrain from participation in the liturgy or the sign of peace and the communal chalice out of care for our wellbeing and not out of unkindness or a lack of piety.

Talk about chat room dangers with your teen

Online chat rooms are great places for people to connect over shared interests and ideas. But for young children and teenagers who may not be internet-savvy, they're also a great place for predators to lay groundwork. In a chat room, anyone can be whomever they want — and predators hide behind personas of friends. Talk to your child about online safety rules, such as never agreeing to meet in person and never providing personal and identifying information. Review chats frequently to ensure that your child is engaging in safe conversations. FACT OF LIFE

In the documentary "Pro-Life Without Exception!" Anna Richy, who gave birth to a child conceived in incest, tells her story about having been molested as a child for several years by her stepfather. When she became pregnant at age 12, her stepfather was afraid the incest would be exposed. He forced Richy to take pills to abort her baby and hit her repeatedly in the stomach until she miscarried. The incest continued another year until she got pregnant again. But Richy didn't want an abortion. She'd already lost one baby and did not want to lose another. Her mother supported her, and offered to help her raise her child. Richy had her daughter and named her Josey.
