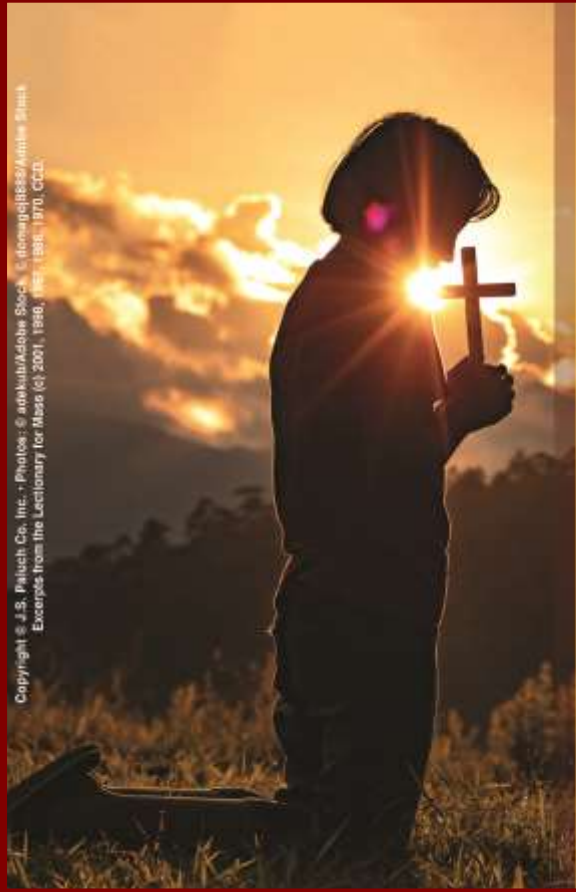

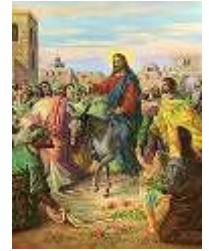

 REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS:

HOSANNA!

“Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest” (Matthew 21:9). With these words the Church enters the holiest of weeks, commemorating the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ. When the people of Jerusalem cried out with their “Hosannas,” they were using an ancient Hebrew shout of acclamation that meant “Pray, save us.” The king to whom they were shouting eventually would save them, but in a way that would be far from what they expected. Salvation would come from the wood of the cross as Jesus hung there to bring freedom from sin and life through death, opening the Gates of Heaven for all who put their faith and trust in Him. " Pope Francis reminded us in his homily on March 20, 2020 (RE: CODIV-19) **of the Church's teaching on Perfect Contrition.** Such contrition arises when the penitent expresses a love of God above all else, the sincere desire for forgiveness, and firm resolution to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation as soon as possible when available. Perfect contrition obtains the forgiveness of sins, both **venial and mortal.** (cf. **Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) 1452**) • The Sacrament of Reconciliation can only be offered when in danger of death or extreme extraordinary situations. We must observe social distancing, while at the same time ensuring privacy for the penitent. There are no confessions by telephone, electronic means, or by "driveup." • **The faithful are to be reminded of their duty to confess serious sins once a year.**"

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION - "in the Eucharist 'unlike any other Sacrament, the mystery [of communion] is so perfect that it brings us to the heights of every good thing: here is the ultimate goal of every human desire, because here we attain God and God joins Himself to us in the most perfect union'...
"...Precisely for this reason it is good to cultivate in our hearts a

constant desire for the Sacrament of the Eucharist. This was the origin of the practice of *'spiritual communion'*, which has happily been established in the Church for centuries and recommended by **saints who were masters of the spiritual life."**

IN ITS RELATIONSHIP TO THE CHURCH

THIS SUNDAY, APRIL 5th, 2020, PALM SUNDAY READINGS:

Gospel at the Procession with Palms — **Jesus' entry into Jerusalem** (Matthew 21:1-11).

First Reading — In spite of my sufferings I am not disgraced. I am not put to shame (Isaiah 50:4-7).

Psalms — My God, my God, why have you abandoned me? (Psalm 22).

Second Reading — Christ emptied himself, and God filled this emptiness with exaltation (Philippians 2:6-11).

Gospel — **The account of Christ's passion according to Matthew** (Matthew 26:14 — 27:66 [27:11-54]).



We encourage all to read and reflect on the Biblical passages that will be proclaimed at Masses next week: Easter Sunday!

First Reading — Peter is an eyewitness: The Lord is risen (Acts 10:34a, 37-43).

Psalms — This is the day the Lord has made; let us Rejoice and be glad (Psalm 118).

(1) Second Reading — All who are baptized, set your hearts in heaven (Colossians 3:1-4) or (2) Second Reading — Christ our Passover is sacrificed; therefore let us celebrate (1 Corinthians 5:6b-8).

Gospel — Three witnesses, Mary, Peter, and John; each responds to the empty tomb (John 20:1-9) or Matthew 28:1-10 (or, at an afternoon or evening Mass, Luke 24:13-35).

FACT OF LIFE

Trapped in an abusive relationship, isolated from family and friends, and embarrassed about her situation, Brienda stared at the two lines on her home pregnancy test. Overwhelming feelings of sadness and confusion boiled over in her heart. She knew she couldn't bring a baby into her current life — especially since she already had a little girl and needed to focus on school. On her way to sign up for college classes, Brienda saw the Woman's Choice Center Stork Bus parked near her school and decided to talk to them. "The women at the center gave me all the information I needed. Then they gave me a support system," she said. "They threw a baby shower for me. They gave me diapers, wipes, and other necessary supplies. I felt like abortion was my only option... until I went to the pregnancy center. I felt alone and defeated at the time but [the pregnancy center] gave me hope, encouragement and support." www.savethestorks.com



Palm Sunday -

One of the most comforting parts of the Passion story for me is the agony in the garden. If the Son of God had to tell himself and his Father, "not as I will, but as you will" (Matthew 26:39); I should be able to say the same. There are times when I would much rather have things always go my way, but that is not going to happen. So it's comforting to know that Jesus did not take the easy way out, but accepted the Father's will that he should suffer and die. Whenever we say the Lord's Prayer we pray, "Thy will be done." But how often do we still take the easy way out? When I have a chance to help someone in need, do I tell myself it's none of my business, or do I ask if there is anything I can do? When I am hurt by the death of a loved one, or am injured in an accident, do I get angry at God for letting this happen, or do I say with Jesus, "Not my will, but yours be done"? Luke's Gospel ends the temptation of Jesus in the desert with the phrase, "When the devil had finished every test, he left him until an opportune time" (Luke 4:13). That time came in the garden, and again Jesus had the last word, choosing to do his Father's will. Even though we know God always does what is best for us when we would rather have what we think is best, at least remember to say, "Not my will, but yours be done." - Tom Schmidt, Copyright (c) J. S. FIVE SIMPLE WAYS TO CELEBRATE HOLY WEEK AT HOME

Create a simple prayer space in your home, and gather there to pray during the week.

Palm Sunday: At your regular Mass time, read the first Palm Sunday Gospel (Mt 21:1-11) and meditate on or discuss what Jesus might be thinking as He enters Jerusalem for the last time.

Holy Thursday: Bake bread for sharing at dinner; make a ritual of stripping the dinner table of all cloths and decorations after dinner.

Good Friday: Pray the Stations of the Cross at 3 p.m.

Holy Saturday: In the morning, read Psalm 64 and break your Good Friday fast solemnly with a simple meal.

Easter Sunday: Dress up the dinner table again. Include candles and crosses, so that the candy baskets aren't the only festive items present. Sing Alleluia and read the Easter Gospel (Matthew 28:1-10) with solemnity and joy.
