GET REAL! Those of us who flatter ourselves that we have a “realistic” view of the world may listen to the first reading today and say, “Get real!” when we hear Luke’s account of the early, Elysian days of the Christian movement. All seems to be rosy, lots of wonders are performed, everyone shares selflessly, they eat together in “exultation,” and the Lord added to their numbers? Well, who wouldn’t be attracted to a group like this? From the wind that swept through the upper room at Pentecost as the Spirit of God blew over the face of the waters in Genesis, and the fire that appeared over each disciple as the light appeared at the dawn of creation, Luke’s intent in Acts is to show a new creation, a restoration of creation’s original goodness through the working of the Holy Spirit. It is the Spirit who continues to make us into the Body of Christ. We may occasionally, like Thomas in the Gospel, say, “Get real!” but our ultimate reality in the Spirit is to work continually to make our Christian community a new creation, one in which others will find God’s joy and beauty. SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

Poor Thomas. Singled out from among the disciples because he refused to believe what they were telling him—that they had seen, in the flesh, their friend and their Lord, Jesus Christ. Can any of us really blame him? All of the disciples were terrified, crestfallen, hiding. But what of Thomas? Just where was he when Jesus appeared the first time to the group huddled in fear? He had gone “out”—out of the community where his faith had life. Maybe this was actually a blessing for Thomas and not the curse associated with the “doubting Thomas” moniker bestowed on him by tradition. Oh, the Divine Mercy of the Lord! Could Thomas be the forerunner of all of us who come in fragile hope and uncertainty to the Christian community, so beautifully described in the reading from the Acts of the Apostles? Could Thomas be an ultimate exemplar of the faith described in the First Letter of Peter?

YOU SHOULD'VE BEEN THERE!

Most of us have had the misfortune of missing something important simply by being absent, and then hearing about what happened. In today's reading, unique to John's Gospel, Thomas is the only apostle who was not around when Jesus appeared to his friends for the first time after his death and resurrection. They were frightened and grieving, not knowing what would happen to them. Remember, they found themselves to be fugitives, seemingly guilty by association with a criminal executed by government officials. Suddenly, Jesus was with them, beaming peace and mercy to his fragile followers. What joy! What a shock, too!

We will never know why Thomas had left their hiding place. All we know is that he returned to wild stories about Jesus being alive after dying a brutal death. He must have thought that the other apostles in their grief had a shared delusion of what they wished were true. When Thomas finally saw Jesus, he gave what is considered the most profound profession of faith: “My Lord and my God!” In his tender mercy, Jesus ministered to Thomas by helping him to see for himself.

WE WALK BY FAITH

But what of us? The early Christian community could only trust the words of these same apostles, the ones Thomas couldn't believe, when they preached Jesus Christ risen from the dead. Who could believe what they said? The Holy Spirit, breathed upon the disciples in that first encounter, emanated so powerfully from them that they were able to convene seemingly utopian communities of faith. Filled with “divine mercy,” their lives became an evangelization to the world.

And this is how we too are sent out, like the disciples, filled with the Holy Spirit and bearing the Lord's peace and mercy to a troubled, suffering world. The wounds of Jesus are very real today in the needy and broken. May we always work to bind up those wounds wherever we find them.

Second Reading — God has given us an undiminished inheritance, safeguarded for us in heaven (1 Peter 1:3-9).

Gospel — The risen Christ comes to his disciples with peace and the Spirit. The absent Thomas doubts (John 20:19-31).



We encourage all to read and reflect on the Biblical passages that will be proclaimed at Masses next week!

First Reading — God has raised the crucified Jesus, who now pours forth the Holy Spirit upon us (Acts 2:14, 22-33).

Psalms — Lord, you will show us the path of life (Psalm 16).

Second Reading — Our faith and hope are in God, who raised Jesus from the dead (1 Peter 1:17-21).

Gospel — Through his words and in the breaking of the bread, the risen Christ made himself known to two disciples on their way to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35).

Learning about our Saints

Saint Adalbert, Bishop and Martyr, c. 956–997

April 23—Optional Memorial

Liturgical Color: Red

Patron Saint of the Czech Republic and Poland

In the frozen North, a courageous Bishop is cut down by rude pagans

St. Adalbert, born April 23, 956 in the Czech Republic (Bohemia), became the Patron Saint of the Czech Republic, Poland and Duchy of Prussia. He was baptized as Vojtěch.

Adalbert came from two of the most powerful families in Bohemia. He was one of at least six boys. He survived a grave illness as a child, and afterwards, his parents decided to dedicate him to the service of God. He was well educated and studied under the tutelage of St. Adalbert of Magdeburg.

Courageous men like Saint Adalbert don't just happen. They are forged over time in red hot fires. Adalbert had a long, difficult, and interesting ecclesiastical career before giving his life for the faith. But he was so impressed with the saintly German Bishop named Adalbert who taught him, that he took his tutor's name at Confirmation.



Cathedral of Gniezno

In 981 his tutor died and young Adalbert returned to Bohemia. Later Bishop Dietmar ordained him a Catholic priest. The Bishop died in 982 and Adalbert, despite his young age of 27, succeeded him as Bishop of Prague.

Although from a wealthy family, he avoided comfort and luxury and was noted for his charity, and austerity. He became a missionary to the Hungarians, Poles, and Prussians. He was exiled twice when trying to conduct clerical reform and in his participation in trying to reform the Christians involved in slave trade, idolatry, and polygamy.

He fled to a Benedictine Monastery in Rome. Later, he founded a Monastery in 995 in Prague. He was martyred (beheaded) on April 23, 997 in his efforts to convert the Prussian pagans to Christianity. His was only age 40. He was canonized in 999. His bones were enshrined at the Cathedral of Gniezno, Poland and the Prague Cathedral.



RESOURCES - Critical Delivery Service

Temporary delivery program for older and dependent adults. As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and the California Safer at Home Initiative, our aging population has an increased need for timely delivery services. WDACS has launched a temporary delivery program called Critical Delivery Services (CDS) to deliver food and other vital items to individuals who are unable to leave their homes due to COVID-19. Who qualifies for delivery services? Delivery services are reserved for those who meet at least one of the following criteria:

- ◆ Aged 60 years and older
- ◆ Individual with a permanent or temporary disability
- ◆ Dependent Adults (aged 18-59 years)

Once items are ready for pick-up, call 888-863-7411. Deliveries can be made: 24 Hours a day; 7 days a week.

How can deliveries be scheduled?

- ◆ Call 888-863-7411 to request delivery service
- ◆ Order items for delivery via online/ phone and provide payment for items to the pick-up location
- ◆ Critical Delivery Service Coordinator will schedule a taxi driver to deliver your items to you
- ◆ Critical Delivery Service Coordinator will call you back to confirm the delivery has been scheduled
- ◆ To schedule deliveries, call hotline M-F, 8:00am to 5:00pm. Same day deliveries are available only during schedule hours.

What can be delivered? Groceries ◆ Household Items ◆ Vital Necessities
Per month, individuals can receive up to: Four (4) deliveries or 40 miles worth of deliveries.

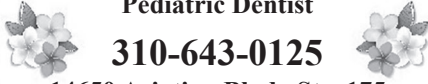
