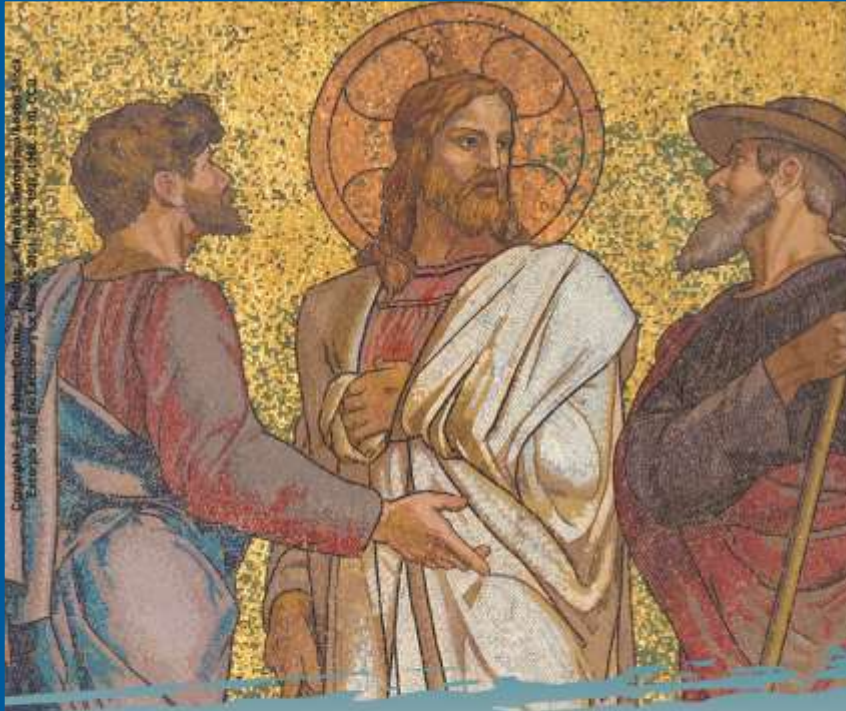

**GOD'S PLAN** - Saint Peter speaks to us twice today. In the first reading, we hear an excerpt from his sermon on Pentecost; in the second, part of his first letter. Once a frightened, uneducated fisherman who often said just the wrong thing, now Peter is speaking what he knows to be true. Everything Jesus had said now makes sense. **His death and rising were all part of God's plan, and our faith and hope can be centered on God.**

**Today's Gospel tells the story of Jesus' walk to Emmaus with two of the disciples. Frightened, sad, and confused, the two of them don't recognize Jesus, who tells them what we heard Peter say above: All this had to happen as part of God's plan. ### *This Sunday, April 26th, 2020 Third Sunday of Easter*

First Reading — God has raised the crucified Jesus, who now pours forth the Holy Spirit upon us (Acts 2:14, 22-33).  
Psalm — Lord, you will show us the path of life (Psalm 16).  
Second Reading — Our faith and hope are in God, who raised Jesus from the dead (1 Peter 1:17-21).  
Gospel — Through his words and in the breaking of the bread, the risen Christ made himself known to two disciples on their way to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35).



*We encourage all to read and reflect on the Biblical passages that will be proclaimed at Masses next week!*

First Reading — All peoples called by God will receive the gift of the Spirit if they repent and are baptized (Acts 2:14a, 36-41).

***Saint Anastasia was born in 281 A.D. and became a perfect symbol of peace, humanity, and solidarity. Her Feast Day is December 25th. She is a symbol of dialogue and collaboration. In her spirit, and in the spirit of love, we welcome all to the Catholic Community of St. Anastasia Catholic Church.***

**Learning about our Saints**

**SAINT CATHERINE OF SIENA (1347-1380)** - Imagine the Pope receiving a young woman still in her twenties who addresses him as “my sweet Christ on earth,” then orders: “Get back to Rome where you belong!” Amazingly, Gregory XI complied! Yet this was but one astonishing incident in the extraordinary life of Catherine of Siena, a truly unique medieval woman. Youngest of twenty-five children, Catherine refused marriage and became a Dominican Tertiary at sixteen, cloistering herself at home in contemplative prayer, austere penances, and mystical experiences, culminating in “spiritual espousal” to Christ. Then, incarnating the Dominican ideal of “passing on to others the fruits of contemplation,” Catherine left her solitude to care for the poor, nurse the sick, comfort the dying, and bury the dead. Increasingly renowned for converting souls and healing bodies, she was sought after to broker peace during civil wars and Church schisms. All this, and like Jesus, whom she called “my Divine Spouse,” she died at thirty-three! Four hundred letters and her spiritual classic, *The Dialogue*, inspired Pope Paul VI to name her, together with Teresa of Ávila, the first women Doctors of the Church.



**St. Catherine of Siena**, original name **Caterina Benincasa**, born March 25, 1347, Siena, Tuscany—died April 29, 1380, Rome; canonized 1461; feast day

April 29). Dominican tertiary, mystic, and one of the patron saints of Italy. She was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1970 and a Patron Saint of Europe in 1999.

**SOME INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT HER LIFE:**

- ♦ She is patroness of the US and Europe, against fire, illness, miscarriages, people ridiculed for their faith, sexual temptation and nurses.
- ♦ Born during the outbreak of the Black Plague.
- ♦ At age 7 she saw a vision of Christ with three saints in a cave where she often prayed and fasted.
- ♦ When her sister died, the family wanted her to marry her sister's widower, but she refused and cut her hair very short, so she would be less attractive to him.
- ♦ Her family home is now a Church.
- ♦ She did not physically write the *Divine Providence*; she had to dictate it. She didn't learn to write until she was 30.
- ♦ She had the “*gift of tears*” renewing the emotions of Christ Himself at the tomb of His friend Lazarus, as did many of the Saints.

The “*gift of tears*” refers to a phenomenon mentioned in spiritual writers since very early in the Church, and it refers to an intense personal experience of God that overflows in abundant tears. It is the overflow of a spiritual experience in an emotional/physiological expression that creates deep comfort in one's soul, and deep encouragement for the person who receives the gift, as well as (sometimes) for others who happen to witness it. The Gift of Tears per se is not mentioned in the Bible, nor in the Catechism.

**FACT OF LIFE**

**Newly acrobat Jen Bricker-Bauer: Everything is possible, even without legs.**

Jen Bricker-Bauer, a newly married 32-year-old living in Los Angeles, likes to remind social media followers of her favorite Bible verse. Mark 9:23 reads, “Everything is possible for the one who believes,” and it seems to sum up Bricker-Bauer's life story. Born to Romanian immigrants in the United States, Jen was left at the hospital by her overwhelmed biological family, when she was born without legs. She hadn't even been given a name. But she was adopted by parents who raised her with the belief that she could do anything. At a 2019 talk in Malaysia, Jen said that the first team of doctors her adoptive parents consulted said that she would never be able to sit up unassisted. But her parents persisted. They went to a second team of doctors at a different hospital, who told them instead that “she's going to do things beyond your wildest imagining.” From then on, Jen wrote on her website, her family gave her “one simple rule, never say can't.” She grew up hearing, “You were born this way for a reason. ### THREE WAYS TO PRACTICE EVERYDAY MERCY IN PANDEMIC

During the Holy Mass on the liturgical feast of Divine Mercy, Pope Francis said:

“Dear brothers and sisters, in the time of trial that we are presently undergoing, we too, like Thomas, with our fears and our doubts, have experienced our frailty. We need the Lord, who sees beyond that frailty an irrepressible beauty. With him we rediscover how precious we are even in our vulnerability.

We discover that we are like beautiful crystals, fragile and at the same time precious. And if, like crystal, we are transparent before him, his light – the light of mercy – will shine in us and through us in the world. As the Letter of Peter said, this is a **reason for being “filled with joy, though now for a little while you may have to suffer various trials” (1 Pt 1:6).**

On this feast of Divine Mercy, the most beautiful message comes from Thomas, the disciple who arrived late; he was the only one missing. But the Lord waited for Thomas. Mercy does not abandon those who stay behind.

Now, while we are looking forward to a slow and arduous recovery from the pandemic, there is a danger that we will forget those who are left behind. The risk is that we may then be struck by an even worse virus, that of *selfish indifference*. A virus **spread by the thought that life is better if it is better for me, and that everything will be fine if it is fine for me.**”

When we are forgiven for our sins, God wants us to remember the mercy we received and share it with others. We cannot forget those left behind. We cannot be the ones to leave them behind.

Here are three simple ways to practice mercy:

1. Praying for others. This is easy to do and can be done anytime, anywhere. Lifting up the needs of others to God is a form of intercession that can obtain great graces for them.
2. Speaking kindly to people and about them. A merciful heart always speaks in the way that Jesus would speak, with kindness and compassion.
3. Doing deeds of mercy. The seven corporal and seven spiritual works of mercy are good ways to show mercy to others. They are listed below for easy reference.

#### The Seven Corporal Works of Mercy



- To feed the hungry.
- To give drink to the thirsty.
- To clothe the naked.
- To shelter the homeless.
- To visit the sick.
- To visit the imprisoned.
- To bury the dead.

#### The Seven Spiritual Works of Mercy

- To counsel the doubtful.
- To instruct the ignorant.
- To admonish the sinner.
- To comfort the sorrowful.
- To forgive all injuries.
- To bear wrongs patiently.
- To pray for the living and the dead.
