

Until we come to a profound realization of how much we need a shepherd, we cannot appreciate how deeply blessed we are to have been given a Shepherd, one who laid down his life for us and was raised to life eternal in the Spirit, so he might guide us and we might follow him in faith forever. During the month of May we Honor and Celebrate, Our Blessed Mother,

Mary! We also honor and celebrate our Mothers! No better way to Honor and Celebrate, than by praying the Rosary!

Throughout the centuries, people have turned to the Rosary during times of trial. But why is that?

Fr. Carl Pieber, International Director of the Miraculous Medal Association, has witnessed many instances in which the Rosary has made a real difference, and he stopped by *Morning Air*® to discuss the power of the Rosary. Fr. Pieber began the conversation by posing the question, “Why the Rosary? Why has this prayer been so effective, powerful, popular, and come down through the ages?” He answered,

“Because it is the only prayer in the Church that takes Scripture, dogma, our belief, the Trinity, God the Father, Jesus Christ, and Mary all in one great prayer. The mysteries of the Rosary tell us all that we believe about the Catholic Church. Many of the dogmas, all the signs, everything we have.” Fr. Pieber explained

the power of the Rosary comes from the power of Mary’s intercession, and her special role as the Mother of God. “When the earliest Christians prayed to Mary, they prayed to her as the Mother of God, the Mother of Jesus Christ, their savior,” he said. “And they knew she was special, they knew she had power, they

knew she was selected by God. And so they knew God wanted her to be God’s mother. ... She loves God so much that God totally works through her ... It’s just amazing how she just takes you right to God.” If you haven’t prayed the Rosary in a while — or ever — Fr. Pieber has a simple piece of advice for you and for

all of us during this uncertain time: “I’m telling you, if you haven’t done it in a while, get to it and do it.”

Saint Anastasia was born in 281 A.D. and became a perfect symbol of peace, humanity, and solidarity. Her Feast Day is December 25th. She is a symbol of dialogue and collaboration. In her spirit, and in the spirit of love, we welcome all to the Catholic Community of St. Anastasia Catholic Church.

SAINTS PHILIP AND JAMES

Saints Philip and St. James were both called to be one of the twelve Apostles of Jesus Christ. Their Feast Day is this Sunday, May 3rd.

Learning about our Saints

St. Philip was first a disciple of St. John the Baptist, being called to God to follow him. Philip preached throughout Greece, Turkey and Syria. He preached and performed many miraculous healings. This encouraged the wife of the proconsul of Hierapolis, to convert to Christianity. The proconsul was furious and Phillip was tortured along with his sister and St. Bartholomew. Phillip and Bartholomew were then crucified upside down and Phillip continued to preach from the cross. The crowd released Bartholomew from the cross but Phillip refused his release and died on the cross. Many paintings and statues are shown with Phillip holding a cross. His relics are venerated today in the Basilica of the Apostles of Rome. **His name means "lover of horses"**, and so he is the Patron Saint of jockeys, horse breeders and horse back riders. **He is also known as the "Patron of bakers"** because he was the apostle that asked Jesus where they would get enough loaves of bread to feed the crowds. He died in 80 A.D.

Saint James the Lesser, son of Alphaeus, (not James, son of Zebedee, also an Apostle who was older than James the Lesser). **James' mission was to preach in Jerusalem.** He was very holy and sacrificed much for his faith. He never drank wine, mead, or cider. He never ate flesh and never shaved his head, bathed or wore sandals. His knees were hard as wood from kneeling so often in prayer. He is also one of the apostles who wrote the Epistle of James to the Romans in the New Testament. James sang in Jerusalem at the first Mass that was ever sung there and later became the first Bishop of Jerusalem. On one Easter morning, the Pharisees asked St. James to tell the crowds that Jesus had deceived the world. He refused to do so and was thrown headlong into the ground. He was then stoned to death. Since the last blow to his head was with a fullers club, that became part of his symbol. He is sometimes called James the Just and many **paintings show him with a fuller's long club.** A fuller is one who cleans soiled wool with a long stick to rid it of impurities. St. James is the Patron Saint of pharmacists, dying people, fullers and hatters. James died in 62 A.D.




FACT OF LIFE


