Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ STANDING FAST ~ Matthew opens the scene in today's Gospel by setting up a conflict. Unlike the parallel story in Mark (7:24), the woman is described as "a Canaanite." This label serves to evoke the ancient animosity between Jews and other peoples in the region. The woman, who is never named, begs for help for her daughter. The disciples are actively dismissive of her, as a woman and a foreigner, and deem her to be unworthy of their attention. The text suggests that Jesus initially sided with the disciples. But then He recognized the strength of her faith. Many women, foreigners, or marginalized persons might identify with this woman's story. Sometimes faith means standing fast, in care for others or in fidelity to truth, even when it seems that no one supports you. Somehow, the woman recognized God's power and God's care within Jesus. And Jesus recognized that God was active within her, manifested in her commitment to her daughter. Jesus saw His Father's larger horizon of care for everyone, Jew and Gentile, within this faith-filled woman.

My name is Nivia Aldrete-Brito (Nivita) and it is a pleasure to join St. Anastasia Parish. My family came to America from Cuba in 1968. I attended St. Joseph Elementary and Bishop Montgomery High School. I have been married to a great man, Alex Aldrete for almost 24 years. My most enjoyable moments are spent serving God, spending time with my parents, dancing, cooking, and traveling.

After my high school years, I continued to volunteer at St. Joseph where I became a Master Catechist and Eucharistic Minister in 1996. FACTS OF LIFE - A Texas family grew by five overnight, reuniting siblings previously separated in foster care. Thomas and Andi Bonura had three biological children of their own, but 11 years ago were told they wouldn't be able to have any more. In 2017, the couple became foster parents. They were immediately paired with the first of their eventual adopted children. The five siblings were all separated, and Bryson, who is now two years old, was the couple's first foster child, straight out of the hospital. Soon, they added two of Bryson's siblings: David and Gabrielle. Then, their older twin brothers Thomas and Carter began to visit their other siblings — but visits weren't enough. "They were sweet and would say, 'Can we come live with you?'" Bonura recalled. The Bonura family happily welcomed Thomas and Carter, but soon, the opportunity arrived to make it official. "One day we got a call saying, '[The parents] are terminating rights. Do you want them?'" Bonura explained. "We said yes." In May, by way of a Zoom call due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Bonuras adopted all five children. Neighbors celebrated with a car parade. "These are their brothers and sisters and there's no argument. The kids have been through a lot but they're the sweetest. They're amazing — and resilient," Bonura explained. "They're fun to be around and they're the greatest kids. God's hand was in it. Our family is complete." www.liveaction.org

Saint Anastasia was born in 281 A.D. and became a perfect symbol of peace, humanity, and solidarity. Her Feast Day is December 25th. She is a symbol of dialogue and collaboration. In her spirit, and in the spirit of love, we welcome all to the Catholic Community of St. Anastasia Catholic Church.

Saint Louis of Toulouse, Feast Day, August 19 ~

This saint was a Franciscan Bishop, the second son of Charles II of Anjou, who was King of Naples, nephew to King St. Louis IX of France and great nephew to St. Elizabeth of Hungary. St. Louis of Toulouse, was born in Provence, France, on February 9, 1274. From his childhood, he made it quite evident, that he wanted to avoid anything that was not directed to the service of God, showing no interest in child-games or distractions. His walks usually led him to a church or monastery, where he delighted in hearing the priests and monks, and their practices of piety. His modesty and Church devotion was an inspiration to everyone. When he was only seven years old, his mother often found him lying in the night, on a mat he had spread on the floor, near his bed that he felt was too soft and comfortable.



In 1284, father of Louis, King Charles II of Naples, was taken prisoner in a sea battle by the King of Aragon. He was released, with the condition, that he send to Aragon as hostages, 50 gentlemen and 3 of his sons. One of these hostages was St. Louis. Confined as a prisoner for seven years, he was subjected to ill treatment, but Louis remained patient. During their captivity, Louis and his two brothers, were educated by Franciscan friars in the Castle of Scuirana. He out did his brothers, in holiness and learning.

Louis was finally set free, by a treaty between his father, King of Naples, and James II, King of Aragon. Both sides decided that Louis, 18 years old, should marry the princess of Majorca, King James' sister. But, the saint's resolution to dedicate his life to God, was not negotiable. He resigned his right to the crown of Naples, begging his father to hand it down to his younger brother, Robert.

He had made a vow during a grave illness, to join the Friars if cured. This was the cause of his recovery. Because his parents were opposed of his joining the Friar Minors, the superiors refused to accept him. Thus, he went to Naples to prepare for Holy Orders, after finally obtaining his father's permission.

He was given a dispensation to receive the Sacrament at age 23, by Pope Boniface VIII. He was made Archbishop of Toulouse, and traveled as a poor religious, but was always greeted as a saintly priest and treated like a Prince.

His modesty, mildness, and devotion, inspired a love of piety, in all who met him. His main concern was to visit hospitals and the poor. He preached frequently. On a return visit to his sister, Queen of Aragon, he was taken by a fever. Realizing that the end was near, he received communion on his knees, with tears in his eyes. In his last moments, he never stopped reciting the Hail Mary. He died August 19, 1297 at the young age of 23.

He is the Patron Saint of: Priests and the Patron of Valencia; Mission San Louis Obispo de Toulouse. His relics reposed originally at the Franciscan Church at Marseille, but relocated in 1423, when they were taken by Alfonso V of Aragon to the Cathedral Church of Valencia. Louis is also the Patron of the town of Valencia. (Valance, France)

Our Reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist “*O Come, Let Us Adore Him*”

IV. Enjoy the silence to which the Holy Eucharist beckons us. Grandiose or plain—a majestic, ornate basilica or a sparsely appointed prison chapel, any space that houses the Blessed Sacrament is special and unique from other locations. There we act differently than in another place. We maintain a respectful decorum before the Holy Eucharist. Before, during and after Mass, we avoid useless talking in the presence of the Tabernacle so as to worship and focus our attention on the Risen Lord Jesus. Christ is summoning each of us to reflect quietly before His Body and Blood. “Who is He?” “Who does God want me to become?” Unnecessary chattering in the hallowed presence of the Holy Eucharist spoils the golden opportunity to learn much at the Master’s Feet. There is a time for opening our mouths: responding to the prayers, singing, greeting our neighbors before and after Mass outside of the Church and in the Church’s vestibule. But when in the *church proper* we love and adore the Eucharistic Jesus by opening our hearts and ears and closing our mouths so to listen to His “pearls of wisdom.” Silence helps us to bask in the Blessed Sacrament’s indescribable glory.

V. Receive Holy Communion with joy and fervor. The worthy reception of the Body and Blood of the Lord—a “foretaste” and “pledge” of Heaven, an impetus for authentic charity towards the poor, weak, defenseless and needy and a nudge towards angel-like chastity—should be the highlight of our day, week, month, year . . . life. Having prepared as indicated, we joyfully and fervently advance in awe towards the Altar. We receive Jesus either on our tongue or in the hand. (A profound bow before receiving is most appropriate.) When receiving on the tongue, one says “Amen” and permits Christ to be placed on it. If receiving in the hand, one makes a “throne” for the Lord by placing his stronger hand on the bottom and his weaker hand on top. Saying “Amen” and receiving the Host (instead of reaching for it), the communicant takes one step to the side, stops, and places the Host in his mouth by using the stronger hand from the bottom. The Host is never received “on the run.” If receiving the Precious Blood from the Chalice (an option in some parishes but not an obligation, since one receives the “total” Jesus—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—even under one Species alone), then the communicant carefully accepts the Chalice after responding “Amen” and consumes the Precious Blood. Our diligent reception of Holy Communion signals our love and adoration for Christ. May we always receive the Son of God with dignity and devotion!






