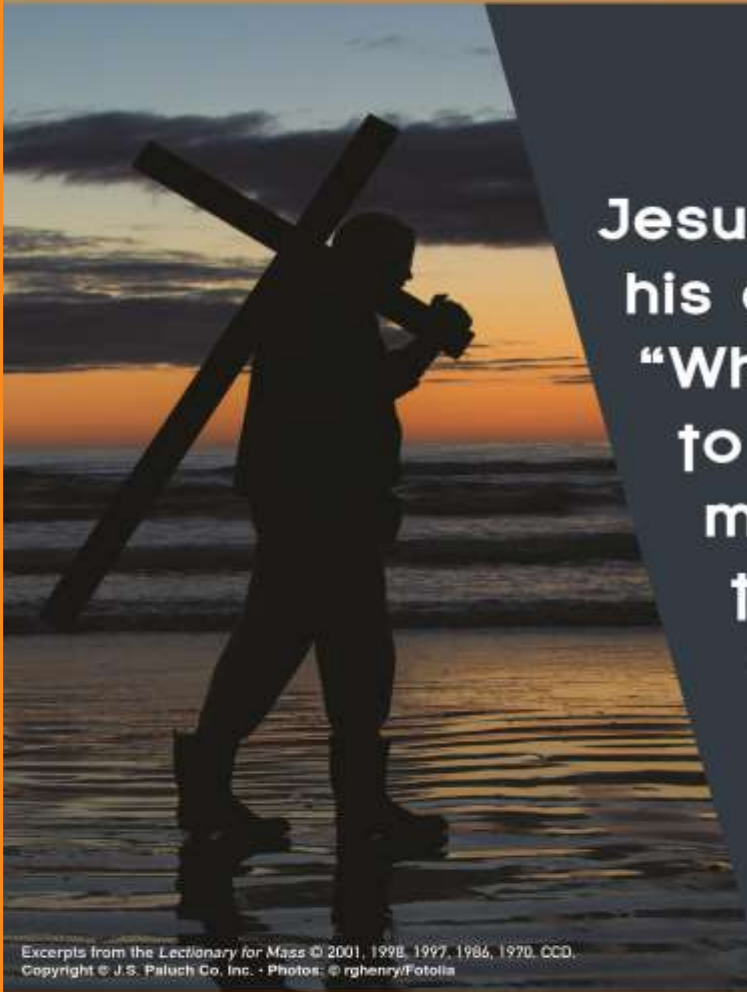

## Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ THE CROSS OF JESUS

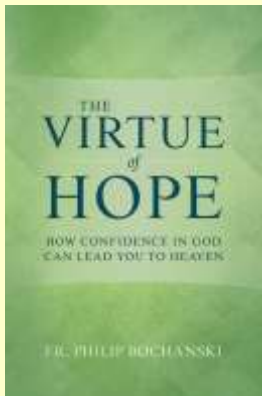
The perception of a cross changed dramatically after Jesus' crucifixion. Before that event, death on a cross was not only horrible, it was degrading. It was a penalty reserved only for the most wretched of criminals. The word "glory" would not have found its way into the same sentence containing the word "cross." But all that changed with Jesus. Over time, believers began to venerate and honor the cross. They painted, sculpted, and carved images of it. Many lost their own lives for their association with it. Today our reverence for and relationship with the cross recalls little of the contempt originally associated with it. As it has been through the ages, it is our perception of the cross that determines how we follow Jesus.

### The Virtue of Hope: How Confidence in God can lead to Heaven

Fr. Philip Bochanski



In this marvelous series of reflections on Hope, adapted from a series of talks, Father Philip Bochanski not only lays out what hope is but, also shows how we can exercise this theological virtue, through being daring, changing our ways, serving the Lord, struggling, suffering, and praying. Bochanski also tells fascinating stories about the lives of individuals like Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, St. Gianna Beretta Molla, and Chiara Luce Badano, showing how these seemingly ordinary Catholic laypeople applied their hope in God to the challenges of their state in life and the modern world. *The Virtue of Hope* is excellent spiritual reading for everyone, an instruction manual for how to grow in hope and in bravery in the face of life's challenges. It is a clarion call that hope must not be merely theoretical, but must "lead us to a deeper relationship with God, an encounter with the One who loves us and calls us to friendship with Himself."

### FACTS OF LIFE

The first coffee shop in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, to employ people with disabilities has just opened its doors. Yakkity Yak Coffee Shack is staffed by people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, and its mission is to ensure that people of all abilities are seen as respected and appreciated members of their community.

Earlier this year, the new venture was announced, with its grand opening delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. But today, the coffee shop is open, serving food and drinks, and is staffed by employees with various disabilities — some are blind, some have Down syndrome, some are autistic, and so on.

## POPE SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT

September 3rd marks the Feast Day of St. Gregory the Great. He was born in Rome, Italy, around 540 A.D. His title came from his excellence as a writer and a ruler.

Although the Western Roman Empire had collapsed long before his birth, many ancient Roman families had much wealth and influence in the city. Gregory was born into one of those families. His great-great grandfather was Pope Felix III, who reigned from 483-492. This was a time before the clergy took the vow of celibacy.

His father was named Gordianus, and was a Senator and a Prefect of Rome. He also held a position in the Church with the title Regionarius. **Gregory's mother, Sylvia, was also from a noble family, and was known for her endless charity to the poor. Gregory continued many of his mother's virtues.** Sylvia and her sister, Pateria, are both canonized Saints in the Catholic Church.

When Gregory was just two years old, in 542, the Black Plague swept through the region. About a third of the population in Italy, was wiped out by this disease. In addition to the disease, the barbarian Ostrogoths, seized and looted Rome in 546.

Eight years later, the Franks tried to invade Rome. **It is believed that Gregory's family retreated to the Island of Sicily where they owned estates, which were used to provide income.**

Finally, after these two events, peace returned to Italy. Gregory was well educated and excelled in all his studies. He also became an expert at law. He excelled so much, that at age 30, he became the Prefect of Rome. After five years, he resigned and founded 6 monasteries on his Sicilian estate. After some time, he became a Benedictine monk in Rome. He renovated his family home into a **monastery and that's where he lived. Following his mother's example of virtues,** he ate three meals a day, along with 12 paupers or homeless, that needed a good meal. **Ordained a priest, Gregory became one of the Pope's seven deacons, and served 6 years in the East, representing the Papacy in Constantinople.**

**According to legend, in 590, Pope Pelagius, Gregory's predecessor, was one of the first to die of the Bubonic Plague.** Gregory was named Pope. This was not what Gregory wanted. He wanted to stay a monk and go to England to Evangelize the British. He left the city and hid in a ditch, but they found him, by the help of a beaming light from heaven! In the end, he accepted the burden of the papacy.

Gregory helped to reform the Church. Priests were not allowed to marry, as forbidden by Church law. Kings were no longer allowed to appoint Church Bishops, that was a job for the Church alone. At that time, Bishops were selling positions in **the Church for money from their relatives, instead of for one's merit (simony). This was no longer acceptable.** The Gregorian Calendar is an accomplishment, named

after Pope Gregory and it became the official time keeping record of 12 months and 365-6 days. It was adopted by countries throughout the world and is still used today.

Gregory was direct and firm. He removed priests from office. He used the papal treasury to ransom prisoners of the Lombards. He also helped victims of the Black Plague and famine.

He was very concerned about the conversion of England, and sent 40 monks from his own monastery, to help convert England. He is known for reforming the liturgy and revising the

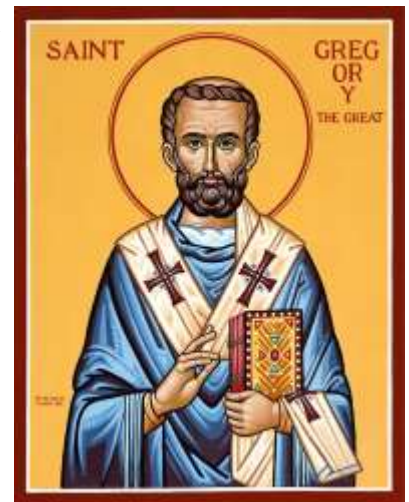
**"Gregorian Chant", which is still used today.** He even interviewed the Lombard king when Rome was under attack.

**Gregory's book, "Pastoral Care," tells of the duties and qualities of a Bishop, and was read for centuries, after his death.** He was skilled at giving homilies and by preaching down to earth applications of the Gospels. **He is called the "Great,"** seated with Augustine, Ambrose, and Jerome, as one of four key Doctors of the Church.

A dove is commonly seen in many pictures of St. Gregory. The dove symbolizes the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. One day while writing, St. Peter the Deacon, saw a dove seated on the hand of St. Gregory, while composing his homily of Ezechiel 1:25, **"a voice came from above the firmament."** Whenever the dove started to **whisper in Gregory's ear, Gregory would start dictating to the Deacon.** When the dove stopped, Gregory stopped dictating.

Gregory died in 604 A.D. at age 64. He is the Patron Saint of: England, Conversion, Musicians, and Teachers

An Anglican historian has written: **"It is impossible to conceive what would have been the confusion, the lawlessness, the chaotic state of the Middle Ages without the medieval papacy and of the medieval papacy; the real father is Gregory the Great".**

3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies. *This promise, along with the next, is simply the reminder on how fervent prayer will help us all grow in holiness by avoiding sin, especially a prayer with the excellence of the Rosary. An increase in holiness necessarily requires a reduction in sin, vice, and doctrinal errors (heresies). St. Louis de Montfort states "Since Mary alone crushed all heresies, as we are told by the Church under the guidance of the Holy Spirit."*

4. It will cause good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of men for the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire for Eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means. This promise, along with the previous, is the positive part, that being is to live in virtue. Becoming holy is not only avoiding sin, but also growing in virtue.

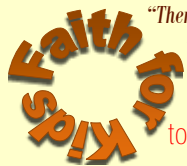

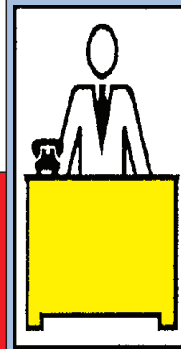
