Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ DIRECTION

Isaiah tells us something that we already know, and yet seem to forget every now and then. He tells us, essentially, that God is God and we are not. When **we're confused and troubled and can't figure everything out, it might be wise to recall Isaiah speaking on the Lord's behalf** and explaining that God—who is on a much more, well, Godly wavelength than we are—**moves in ways we can't even imagine.** Saint Paul, by comparison, has everything figured out. Kind of. At least he understands his calling in life—to magnify Christ in everything he does. That should give all of us the direction we need. ‘A true inspiration’: Parents choose life for baby girl born with organs outside her body

A two-year-old from Cambridge born with her stomach, liver, and bowel on the outside of her body, continues to defy the odds, after her parents rejected advice from doctors to have an abortion. Doctors did not expect Laurel Phizacklea, who was born with a major exomphalos – a condition which occurs when the baby’s abdominal wall does not form during pregnancy – to survive birth. They advised her parents, Kelly and Sean, to consider abortion following a 12-week scan. But they refused, wanting to give their daughter a chance at life, now Laurel continues to defy expectations. Over the past two years, skin has formed around the organs, and Laurel can eat, drink, and go to the toilet like any other toddler.

SAINT PADRE PIO FEAST DAY, SEPTEMBER 23rd


Most of you are familiar with Saint Padre Pio, one of our more recent canonized Saints. He received sainthood June 16, 2002, by Pope John Paul II. St. Padre Pio was an Italian friar who was known for his piety, adoration of charity, and love for the people around him. He also received the gift of the stigmata.

St. Pio was born May 25, 1887 in Pietrelcina, Italy. He was the second born, with an older brother and three younger sisters. Two other siblings had died in infancy. He was named Francesco Forgione and grew up in a poor family of farmers. Twice his father worked in Jamaica and New York to provide for his family.

At the very young age of five, he dedicated his life to God. He wanted to join the religious life as he lived to go to church and to pray. His mother said he was a very quiet child. His family attended daily Mass and Francisco was an altar boy. He was known for taking on penances and his mother once scolded him for sleeping on a stone floor. But, his parents were very religious and supported his Catholic development. Being very poor, he spent many months tending the families flock of sheep. This meant that he fell behind the other children his age. He was also of poor health. He had suffered an attack of gastroenteritis at age six and typhoid fever at age 10. Later, after three years of education, he tried to become a friar. His parents went to a nearby monastery and requested that he join the monks. He was evaluated and told he needed more education. So, his parents decided to hire a tutor. This is when his father went to New York, for work and send home money to his family. At the age of 15, Francisco was finally ready to enter religious life with the Capuchin Friars at Morcone. He took the name Pio in honor of Pope Paul I, whose relic was housed in Pio's local chapel. At age 23, Padre Pio was ordained to the priesthood. The center of his spirituality was the Mass. He took long pauses of contemplative silence at different parts of the Mass. The Mass could sometimes take several hours. When asked to shorten his Mass he replied, "God knows that I want to say Mass just like any other priest, but I cannot do it." Everyone was deeply impressed by his piety and came to seek his counseling. Pilgrims began to come to him by the thousands, from all over the world, attracted by his spirituality. To his followers he would say, "It seems to me as if Jesus has no other concern but the sanctification of your soul." Padre Pio was especially noted for his devotion to prayer. When asked what legacy he wished to leave to the world he said, "My child, the Rosary" and "We must empty Purgatory with our prayers."

Padre Pio continued to have poor health into his adult years, thus he stayed close to his hometown of Pietrelcina. He offered all of his sufferings to God as a sacrifice. He said, "I am fully convinced that my illness is due to a special permission from God." On Friday, September 20, 1918, Padre Pio was praying after

Mass in front of a crucifix, when the marks of the stigmata, the wounds of Christ, appeared on Padre Pio's body. He was 31 years old and became the first stigmatized priest in the history of the Church. He resigned himself to this suffering, for the next 50 years of his life. In 1919, his superiors called for two medical examinations of the stigmata. Neither doctor had any explanation.



Saint Pio began his days at 2:30 am, rising for prayer and preparing for Mass. He required only a few hours of sleep at night and only consumed 300-400 calories a day. God endowed Padre Pio with many spiritual gifts including--the gift of healing, bilocation, prophecy, miracles, discernments of spirits, the ability to sustain beyond the normal requirements for sleep and nourishment, ability to read hearts, the gift of tongues, the gift of conversions, and the gift to see angelic beings. The fragrance, which emanated from his wounds, frequently announced his invisible presence. Between Mass and confessions, his workday lasted 19 hours. He rarely left the monastery. This was his schedule for 51 years.

In 1947, Fr. Karol Wojtyla visited Padre Pio, who prophesied that Fr. Karol Wojtyla would, "rise to the highest post in the Church." Fr. Wojtyla, of course, became Pope John Paul II in 1978, some thirty years later. Padre Pio became internationally famous. He was known for his piety, charity, and quality of his preaching. His famous advice was, "Pray, hope, and don't worry." Padre Pio used his newfound popularity, to open a hospital in San Giovanni Rotondo, in 1956. This was called, "Home for Relief of Suffering" and became the model for Catholic Hospitals. This as an example of the continuation of Christ's healing ministry. He is also known for the many Prayer Groups that he started.

Padre Pio died September 23, 1968, at the age of 81, with his Rosary in his hands. His last words were, "Jesus, Mary" which, he repeated over and over until he breathed his last breathe. He had often said, "After my death, I will do more. My real mission, will begin after my death." Every year, 8 million pilgrims visit the Monastery of Our Lady of Grace, in San Giovanni Rotondo, Italy, to pray at the tomb of St. Pio of Pietrelcina. St. Pio's Shrine, is second only to Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico, in its number of annual visitors.

Pope Paul VI, dismissed any concerns over Padre Pio's conduct and affirmed the authenticity of his Stigmata. Two miracles on behalf of Padre Pio were confirmed and the quest for his Sainthood began. It was none other than Pope John Paul the II, who addressed the pilgrims in St. Peter's Square, in 1999, that Padre Pio was now Blessed Padre Pio. Three years later, on June 16, 2002, Pope John Paul II gave the homily at the Canonization of Saint Padre Pio.

St. Padre Pio's is the Patron of: The City of Pietrelcina, Civil Defense Volunteers, Adolescents, Stress Relief, and January Blues (aka - Seasonal Affective Disorder).
