Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time
~ GOD REVEALED TO THE NATIONS

What wonderful images we have today of the reign of God! Isaiah speaks to us of a great feast—a heavenly feast—a feast of abundance with rich foods and choice wines. It is the **Lord's own affair, Isaiah explains, when God will unite all nations, dry every tear, and destroy death forever. Then, too, will the entire earth rejoice in the Lord and bask in God's saving grace.** Jesus speaks of heaven in terms of a feast as well. Here, **the kingdom of heaven is likened to a king's wedding feast given for his son.** This is a feast of abundance also, with the **fattened cattle prepared just so. But many of the people invited don't want to come, so the king invites anyone who would honor his son by their presence there.** And Paul tells us that whether we live abundantly or in humble circumstances, we can do all things in the Lord who strengthens us. - Copyright © J. Did You Know? Is your caregiver safe?

Many families are stretched thin during this pandemic and may be relying on childcare from different places — family members, neighborhood swaps, or in-home care. **Any time you leave your child in someone else's care, make sure you do your due diligence on the reputation of that caregiver.** Fundamentally, you must trust the caregiver is a safe person — ask for references, conduct interviews, survey the physical space(s) where your child will be playing, sleeping, eating. Discuss the level and kind of supervision your child needs to be sure the caregiver understands what you **expect, given your child's age(s) and activity level(s).** It may also be important to consider whether the caregiver is able to physically and emotionally care for your child? For example, older family members may not be able to chase energetic young children for a full day. Saint Anastasia was born in 281 A.D. and became a perfect symbol of peace, humanity, and solidarity. Her Feast Day is December 25th. She is a symbol of dialogue and collaboration. In her spirit, and in the spirit of love, we welcome all to the Catholic Community of St. Anastasia Catholic Church.

SAINT TERESA OF AVILA , FEAST DAY, OCTOBER 15th

Teresa was born in the 16th century, March 28, 1515, a time of turmoil and reform. She was born just before the Protestant Reformation, the start of the Inquisition, just after Columbus had opened the western hemisphere to European colonization and died 20 years after the closing of the Council of Trent.

She was named Teresa Sanchez de Cepeda y Ahumada and was a Spanish noblewoman in Avila, Spain. She lived in an age of exploration, as well as political, social, and religious reform. A famous quote from her biography is, "Just being a woman is enough for my wings to fall off." This tells us that despite all the turmoil and put down of women, Teresa would not let herself be pushed back.

Both Teresa's parents were pious Catholics and, in some ways, inspired their daughter to take up a life of prayer. Though, as a teenager, she only cared about boys, clothes, flirting, and rebellion. She lost her mother at age 15, and at age 19, her father sent her to an Augustinian Convent as a boarder. She hated it at first, but began to enjoy it when her love for God began to grow, and because the convent was less strict than her father. In 1536, she enters the Carmelite Convent of the Incarnation in Avila, as a novice.

When the time came to stay as a nun or choose marriage, it was a hard decision. But, she chose religious life because she was so prone to sin, that she felt it was the safest choice.

During her life, she spent much time writing. She once wrote, "I only wish that I could write with both hands, so as not to forget one thing while I am saying another."

Among her books or compilation of her writings are: The Interior Castle or (The Mansions), The Way of Perfection, The Letters of Saint Teresa, and Autobiography of St Teresa.

Her health was never good. She suffered through malaria, endured migraine headaches, and was stricken with a form of epilepsy. She was an invalid for three years. During this time, she developed a love for mental prayer. After her recovery, Teresa underwent a religious awakening. Teresa continued for 15 years divided between a worldly and divine state.

Teresa explains mental prayer like this, "For mental prayer in my opinion is nothing else than an intimate sharing between friends; it means taking time frequently to be alone with Him who we know loves us. The important thing is not to think much but to love much and so do that which

best stirs you to love. Love is not great delight but DESIRE to please God in everything."

Three years later, she began to seriously consider the restoration of the Carmelite life to its original state of austere observance. She was ordered by Pope Pius IV, in 1562, to open the first convent of the Carmelite **Reform, St. Joseph's**. She received much criticism because she staunchly insisted on poverty and subsistence, only through public alms. However, Rome gave approval in 1567, which made this just the first of 17 convents or monasteries established by St. Teresa. She is credited with reviving Catholicism in the 1560's and 1570's, when Protestantism threatened to bring down the Church. Her most significant contribution was the founding of the Reformed Discalced

(barefoot) Carmelite Convent of San Jose, Spain, a religious order for women.

In 1582, she was to establish a convent, wanted by her Archbishop, in Avila. But when she arrived, in pouring rain, to discuss the possibilities, he ordered her to leave. Even though she was very ill, she was commanded to attend to a noblewoman giving birth. By the time they got there the baby had already arrived, and Teresa said, "The saint won't be needed after all." Being too ill to leave, she soon died there, on October 4, at the age of 67 in Alba de Tormes.

Saint Teresa of Avila was canonized by Pope Gregory XV, 40 years after her death. She has also been recognized as a Doctor of the Church by Pope Paul VI. The first such honor given to a woman. She is one of four, the others being Hildegard of Bingen, Catherine of Siena and Therese of Lisieux.

Saint Teresa of Avila, aka Teresa of Jesus, is Patroness of Spain, sharing the title with St. James the Apostle. She is also patroness of headache sufferers and writers.



♥ The Power of The Rosary Our Lady's 15 Promises for Praying the Rosary



15. Devotion to my Rosary is a great sign of predestination. Predestination in this context means that, by the sign which is present to a person from the action of devoutly praying the Rosary, God has pre-ordained your salvation. Absolute certainty of salvation can only be truly known if God reveals it to a person because, although we are given sufficient Grace during life, our salvation depends upon our response to said Grace. (See Summa Theologica, Question 23 for a detailed theological explanation). Said another way, if God has guaranteed a person's salvation but has not revealed it to Him, God would want that person to pray the Rosary because of all the benefits and Graces obtained. Therefore the person gets a hint by devotion to the Rosary. This is not to say that praying the Rosary guarantees salvation - by no means. In looking at promises #3 and #4, praying the Rosary helps one to live a holy life, which is itself a great sign that a soul is on the road to salvation. (See also paragraphs 381, 488, 600, 2782 in the Catechism of the Catholic Church.) In fact, St. Louis de Montfort says even more strongly that "an infallible and unmistakable sign by which we can distinguish a heretic, a man of false doctrine, an enemy of God, from one of God's true friends is that the hardened sinner and heretic show nothing but contempt and indifference to Our Lady..." [True Devotion to Mary, #30]
