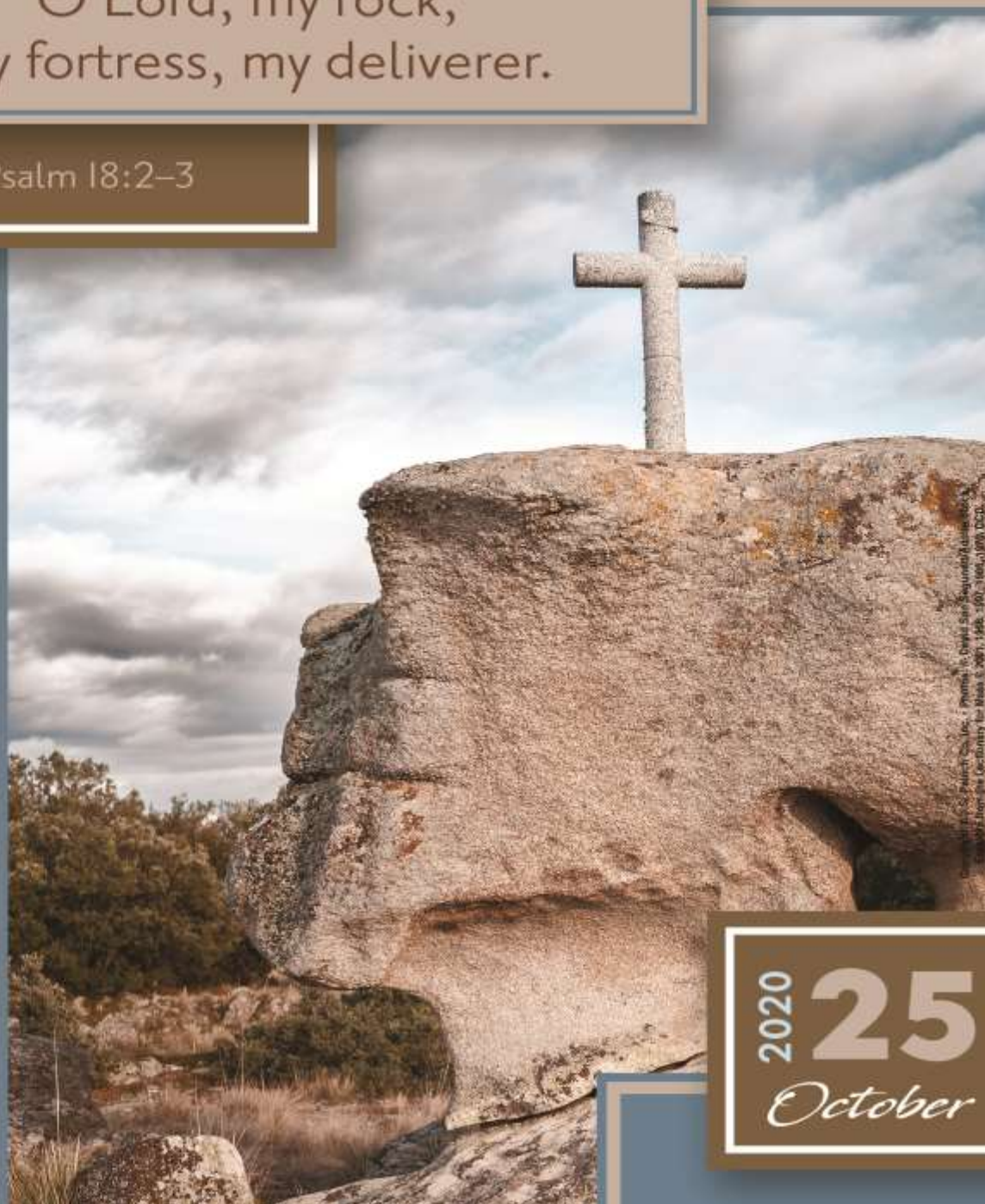

NOVEMBER 1st, SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS

Today the Church celebrates all the Saints: canonized or beatified, and the multitude of those who are in heaven enjoying the beatific vision that are only known to God. During the early centuries, the Saints venerated by the Church, were all martyrs. After a time, the Popes set November 1st, as the day for commemorating all the Saints. We all have this "universal call to holiness." What must we do in order to join the company of the Saints in heaven? We "must follow in His footsteps and conform [our]selves to His image seeking the will of the Father in all things. [We] must devote [our]selves with all [our] being to the glory of God and the service of [our] neighbor. In this way, the holiness of the People of God will grow into an abundant harvest of good, as is admirably shown by the life of so many saints in Church history." (*Lumen Gentium*, 40).



NOVEMBER 2nd, The Commemoration of All Faithful Departed ~ All Soul's Day

All Souls' Day, is a Christian day, set aside to pray for those who have departed from this world. Many religions believe that through prayer, the departed souls will be blessed with eternal life in Heaven. Some religions believe in an intermediary "place" called Purgatory and through prayers, the departed souls are lifted out of purgatory into eternal life. Some religions do not believe in a specific intermediary place but do believe that prayers help the departed souls. What is similar in these various religions, is the belief that through prayer for the departed souls, a purifying process to remove sins occurs and the departed souls are then made ready for eternal life. The first Biblical mention of praying for the deceased began in the book of Machabees.

Due to COVID-19, we will not be able to have our traditional "Remembrance Table" this year. FACTS OF LIFE

Soon after the birth of my son Charlie, who has Down syndrome, a visitor asked whether he was "mild, moderate, or severe"—referring to his level of cognitive impairment. I knew the terminology, but the question shocked me. In my arms I held my beautiful baby boy, who defied easy categorization. Clinical labels may describe some aspects of an individual's "functioning," but they don't tell the whole story. Labels could not describe how Charlie's smile lit up a room or how the sweetness of his soul had captured our hearts so completely. It's like looking at a stained-glass window from the outside: the colors look dark, and you can't quite make out the figures. From the inside, however, with the sun shining through it, the effect can be brilliant. From inside our family, love illuminates our life with Charlie. What may seem dreary to others, perhaps even unbearable, is actually filled with beauty and color. We know, for instance, that Charlie worked hard to gain basic feeding skills that most people take for granted, and we are so proud of his valiant efforts. www.respectlife.org

SAINTS SIMON & JUDE, FEAST DAY, OCTOBER 28th

Both Jude and Simon were ordinary men, who were chosen by Christ, to spread the Good News. Jude and Simon are mentioned together because they traveled as a team, preaching and spreading the Good News of Christ. Much of their time was spent in Persia. Jude is English for the Greek name Judas. Judas was also called Judas of Thaddaeus, which in Aramaic means

“brawny lad.” or **Lebbaeus, a surname, meaning “man of heart.”** But, Jude was also referred to as Judas of James. In the New Testament Epistle of Jude, it was written, **Judas the brother, we aren’t sure if James was his actual brother or a close relative, but we do know that he was one of the chosen 12 Apostles. Not to be confused with Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Jesus. Jude is also called “Saint of last resort,” the one you ask for help when all else fails. Since his name reminds people of Judas of Iscariot, there is a tendency for someone asking for intercessory prayer, to choose one of the other Apostles first. Hence, people also call him the “patron of desperate causes.” St. Jude as mentioned, is the author of a short Epistle, which forms part of the New Testament. The symbol, often used with Jude, is a T-square, which points him out as an architect of the House of God, or among God’s principal workmen.**

Simon is called the “Zealot” or former (crooked) tax collector. A zealot is someone who is strongly committed to something. In Simon’s case, he firmly believed in the importance of people following Jewish law. Once he met Jesus, his life was changed, and he became convinced that the most important thing was to follow Jesus and His teachings. Another reason why Simon had a nickname, was to keep people from confusing him with the other Simon, the one Jesus called Peter.

Simon and Jude traveled together to teach others about Jesus. Because of **their eyewitness accounts of Jesus’ miracles, death and resurrection, many people became believers and were baptized. They were martyred for their faith on the same day, October 28th, in Beirut, 65 AD.**

Jude was beaten to death and beheaded or hacked to death. His remains were later returned to Rome, where they were buried in a crypt under St. Peter’s Basilica. Simon was believed to be sawn in half. Many pictures show him with the symbol of a saw. Other traditions, say he was crucified. Simon was buried in the same tomb as St. Jude, in the left transept of the Basilica in Rome, under the altar of St. Joseph. These two saints remind us to learn all we can about Jesus and to share it with others, as they did.

St. Jude: Patron of the Diocese of St. Petersburg, Florida, forgotten causes, hospitals, and desperate situations.

St. Simon: Patron of curriers, sawyers, and tanners.

MARYMOUNT SENIOR’S FREE TUTORING PROGRAM HELPS STUDENTS DURING PANDEMIC.

Last April, Sophia Scott faced something highly unusual in her life: a summer that was completely free.

The Marymount High School senior normally would spend her summer as a student intern, like last year, when she shadowed doctors at the UCLA Concussion Clinic.

“I was going to do another medical internship, but because of COVID-19, hospitals were closed to visitors, so that was completely off the table,” she said.

And, with stay-at-home orders in effect in Los Angeles, Scott knew she wouldn’t be able to hang out with friends during vacation. She was determined, however, to make the best of it.

“Once everything fell through, I wanted to make sure I used my time as well as I could,” she said.

And, so she did. Within weeks, the 17-year-old had founded and launched Quaranteens, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit dedicated to providing individual, virtual tutoring services in a wide array of subjects to K-12 students — all free of charge.

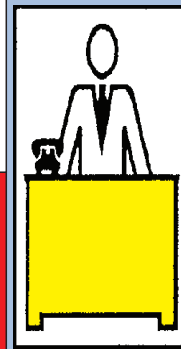
