



SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS ~ OUR HOPE AND GOD'S PROMISE ~~ The Church uses these waning November days and darker skies as the season to remind us of the last things. Today's feast, the Solemnity of All Saints, is the centerpiece of three days that point to doctrines we proclaim each time we say the Apostles' Creed: "We believe in the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting." And while the days and our hearts may be dark, the readings today are bright with the light of faith. John's vision in the Book of Revelation, reveals dazzling angels and white-robed saints gathered in triumph around the throne of God. In the responsorial psalm we sing our longing to see God's face, and in the second reading John writes that we are God's children and will, in fact, see God "as he is" (1 John 3:2). This is our hope. This is God's promise. Today we celebrate the triumph of those who already gaze on the face of God. Tomorrow we cry out for mercy with those in purgatory, who, like us on earth, still long to see God's face.

FACTS OF LIFE

Serving life: How pro-life pregnancy centers are making a difference

The Charlotte Lozier Institute, the research arm of pro-life group Susan B. Anthony List, reported that more than 2,700 pro-life pregnancy centers around the U.S. served nearly two million people in 2019, providing nearly \$270 million in services. These centers included both brick-and-mortar establishments, but also mobile medical centers, serving both expectant mothers and post-abortive women, with the vast majority of facilities offering parental education, material assistance for mothers, and ultrasound tests.

"Pregnancy centers exist to serve and support mothers in the courageous decision to give their children life, even under the most difficult circumstances," Chuck Donovan, president of the Charlotte Lozier Institute, stated on Wednesday. "This report calculates the impact of their mission of love in concrete terms."

ALL SAINTS DAY, NOVEMBER 1st ALL SOULS DAY, NOVEMBER 2nd

All Saints Day, also known as All Hallows. Hallows meaning **Saints, is the day after All Hallows' Eve (Halloween).** It is a Feast Day celebrated on November 1, by all Roman Catholics. Halloween has been translated from “Eve of Hallows” which, was a holy day celebrating the day before All Saints Day. Long ago in Ireland and Britain, Christians gathered together on All Hallows’ Eve, to ask for God’s blessing and protection from the evil in the world. Today’s Halloween, consists of wearing saintly or evil costumes, to act out the battle between good and evil. The day after Halloween, All Saints Day, gives believers the opportunity to remember all Saints and Martyrs, known and unknown, throughout Christian History. As a part of this day of obligation, Catholics are required to attend Mass.

Remembering saints and martyrs, and dedicating a special day to them each year, has been a Christian tradition since the 4th century AD. It wasn't until Pope Boniface IV decided to remember All Saints. Originally, May 13 was designated as the feast of All Holy Martyrs. Later, in 837 AD, Pope Gregory IV extended the festival to remember all the Saints, and changed the date to the 1st of November. We celebrate the communion of saints, those people we believe are in heaven, through good works and God's grace.

Pope John Paul II, All Saints Day 2003 wrote:

“We celebrate today the solemnity of All Saints. This invites us to turn our gaze to the immense multitude of those who have already reached the blessed land, and points us on the path that will lead us to that destination.”

All Saints Day and All Souls Day are related, but they are two separate feasts.

All Souls Day is on the 2nd of November, directly following All Saints Day, and is an opportunity for Roman Catholics to commemorate the faithful departed and asking God's mercy for them. They remember and pray for the souls of people who are in Purgatory, the place or state in which those who have died atone for their less grave sins, before being granted the vision of God in Heaven, called the Beatific Vision.

The reasoning behind this, is the belief that when the soul leaves the body, it is not entirely cleansed of venial sins. However, through the power of prayer and self-denial, the faithful left on earth may be able to help these souls gain the Beatific Vision they seek, bringing the soul eternal happiness. It is on that day, that the Book of the Dead, is opened, to allow parishioners to write the names of relatives to be remembered in this book or an individual listing of names. These names are “placed on or near the altar.”

This is done all through November, as an All Souls tradition.

Other rituals include the offering of a Requiem Mass for the dead, visiting family graves, and reflecting on lost loved ones. In Mexico, on the Day of the Dead or (El Dia los Muertos), people take picnics to their family graves and leave food out for their dead relatives. While praying for the dead has been an ancient Christian tradition, it was Abbot Odilo of Cluny, France who, in 998 AD, designated November 2nd as a special day for remembering and praying for those in the process of purification. This started as a local feast in his monastery, gradually spreading throughout the Catholic Community towards the end of the 10th century AD.

Letter of Pope John Paul II for the Millennium of All Souls Day:

“For the souls in Purgatory, waiting for eternal happiness and for meeting the Beloved is a source of suffering, because of the punishment due to sin which separates them from God. But there is also the certitude that once the time of purification is over, the souls will go to meet the One it desires.”



Thank you so much to all parishioners, families, and individuals who participated in the Box of Joy project! Even though this was our first time participating on this program through the Cross Catholic Outreach (a ministry that provides food, shelter, medical care, water, education, self-help programs, care for orphans, and emergency relief to the poorest in Dioceses around the world in the name of Christ), thanks to your generosity we have been able to create 50 boxes in a very short period of time. These boxes are going to make some children very happy this Christmas! Somewhere, not that far from us, making it very true the words: The Box of Joy is a Christmas blessing that says: “God loves you, and so do I!”


