FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD ~ ~ It may seem obvious that the theme for the Baptism of the Lord is “water,” but when one spends time with the readings today, one can see many different connotations for that water and its power. Isaiah calls the poor who are thirsty and tired to come to the water and take the spiritual food and drink that will be provided if we but seek the Lord. Here, God is both destination and consolation. The responsorial psalm follows suit with the image of drawing water from the springs of salvation. 1 John takes us to the reality of Christ as eucharist: not only **Jesus’ birth and baptism, but his death, as we hear that Jesus came “by water and by blood.”** The Gospel depicts **John baptizing** Jesus with water, and the Spirit baptizing Jesus. We experience both the humanity and the divinity of Christ. Indeed, water has much power to save us. - Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.



15 CATHOLIC NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS! (Cont.)

Read something worthwhile. You'll have to determine for yourself what a good goal would be—one spiritual book a month or half an hour of spiritual reading a day or maybe just one book this year—but reading worthwhile books can be an absolute game-changer. Commit to daily *silent prayer*. I never tire of telling people that while a devotion to the Rosary or the Liturgy of the Hours or even the Bible isn't a requirement for canonization, regular silent prayer is. This is what makes Saints. Every other kind of prayer (and [there are many](https://www.piercedhands.com/50-ways-talk-god/) - https://www.piercedhands.com/50-ways-talk-god/) only exists to lead you into silent prayer, but most of us spend all our prayer time doing and very little being. This year, commit to a certain amount of time *every day without fail* just being still before the Lord, talking to him and listening, too. A good rule of thumb is one minute per day for every year old you are, which is great if you're 15 but not so much if you're 45 with a million little kids and no experience with silence. Start with 15 minutes a day, see if you can't stretch it to 20 for Lent, then go from there.

In accordance with recent U.S. Supreme Court rulings, Los Angeles County Public Health recently gave permission for our Churches to reopen, with specific limitations.

Out of great concern for the health and well-being of our Parish, amid COVID-19 and winter weather, we have created the following schedule to try to accommodate as many Parishioners as possible to attend Mass, while being mindful of the CDC guidelines:

Sunday 7am Mass- Indoor Service - Church

Sunday 9am Mass- Outdoor Service - Pastors Plaza

THE WATERS OF BAPTISM ~ When new sod is put in, it needs constant saturation with water. Landscapers say that this “knits” the sod to the soil. The same when a branch is grafted onto a tree: the poultrice that joins them at the splice must be kept wet at all times. Water is the stuff that binds the very cells of our bodies together. No wonder religions throughout all times and cultures have used it so prominently. When Jesus stepped into the Jordan for baptism, he “knit” himself to what had come before him. By going to the Jordan, he made himself one with the people of Israel who had crossed it into their Promised Land. With John the Baptist, Christ wove himself into the prophetic tradition that heralded the coming reign of God. He had become fully human in the waters of Mary’s womb, and by partaking in the rite of the baptism of repentance, Jesus identified himself with our sinful, frail humanity. It is through the waters of baptism that Christ continues to graft new members onto his Body, the Church; through these waters we are cleansed from sin and filled with the promise of grace, given our destiny for eternal life. FACTS OF LIFE

Police officer and his wife adopt toddler he rescued from abusive home

Two and a half years after first saving a toddler from an abusive home, an Arizona police officer and his family adopted the little girl. Lieutenant Brian Zach was a patrol officer in Kingman, Arizona, at the time. He responded to a residence check in March 2018, where he found a toddler who was living in abusive home.

Zach said that **during the check, he and the little girl, Kaila, "colored [and] snacked ... she held my hand and she was just this cute little thing."** Detectives soon arrived at the scene and took Kaila to the hospital for her injuries.

According to Lieutenant Zach, criminal charges were filed against Kaila's abusers.

A little over two years after first rescuing her, the Zachs were able to bring Kaila home permanently as their daughter on August 18th.

Pope Francis calls for a commitment to 'take care of each other' in 2021

Pope Francis warned on Sunday, January 3rd, against the temptation to ignore the suffering of others during the coronavirus pandemic and said that things will get better in the new year to the extent to which the needs of the weakest and most disadvantaged are prioritized.



"We don't know what 2021 has in store for us, but what each of us and all of us together can do is to commit ourselves a little more to take care of each other and of creation, our common home," the pope said in his Angelus address Jan. 3.
In the live video broadcast from the Apostolic Palace, the pope said that "things will get better to the extent that, with God's help, we work together for the common good, putting the weakest and most disadvantaged at the center."
The pope said that there is a temptation to take care only of one's own interests during the pandemic and "to live hedonistically, that is, seeking only to satisfy our own pleasure."
He added: "I read something in the newspapers that saddened me greatly: in one country, I forget which, more than 40 aircraft left, to enable people to flee from the lockdown and to enjoy the holidays." "But those people, good people, did they not think about those who stayed at home, about the economic problems faced by many people who have been floored by the lockdown, about the sick? They thought only about taking a holiday for their own pleasure. This pained me greatly." Pope Francis addressed a special greeting to "those who begin the new year with greater difficulties," mentioning the sick and the unemployed. "I like to think that when the Lord prays to the Father for us, He does not merely speak: He makes Him see the wounds of the flesh, He makes Him see the wounds He suffered for us," he said.
"This is Jesus: with His flesh He is the intercessor, he wanted to bear even the signs of suffering." In a reflection on the first chapter of the Gospel of John, Pope Francis said that God became man to love us in our human frailty. "Dear brother, dear sister, God became flesh to tell us, to tell you that He loves us ... in our frailty, in your frailty; right there, where we are most ashamed, where you are most ashamed. This is bold," he said. "Indeed, the Gospel says that He came to dwell among us. He did not come to visit us, and then leave; He came to dwell with us, to stay with us. What, then, does He desire from us? He desires a great intimacy. He wants us to share with Him our joys and sufferings, desires and fears, hopes and sorrows, people and situations. Let us do this, with confidence: let us open our hearts to Him, let us tell Him everything."
Pope Francis encouraged everyone to pause in silence before the nativity to "savor the tenderness of God who became near, who became flesh."
The pope also expressed his closeness to families with young children and to those who are expecting, adding "a birth is always a promise of hope."
"May the Holy Mother of God, in whom the Word became flesh, help us to welcome Jesus, who knocks on the door of our hearts to dwell with us," Pope Francis said. "Without fear, let us invite Him among us, into our homes, into our families. And also ... let us invite Him into our frailties. Let us invite Him, so that He may see our wounds. He will come and life will change."
