#### 1. HEAR

#### 2. TALK

Back in the time of Jesus, leprosy was a very scary disease and so contagious and serious that people with leprosy had to live far away from everyone and they could not live with or see their families.

Right now for almost a year we have been living in a pandemic that has kept us living away from others. Take some time and share with your family what this experience has been like and where you see God in all of this. Here are some questions you might share with your family:

 What has it been like for you to be away from your family and friends outside of your house during the pandemic?

Share with us how you are living out your faith at home. Use #LACatholicsBelieve and tag @LACatholics on social media.

- Sunday is Valentine's Day— how have you felt the love of Jesus during these very difficult times?
- Even in the midst of the pandemic, what are the blessings from God that you have experienced?
- The Leper approached Jesus and asked for healing. What healing do you or others need that you can ask Jesus for?



### 3. PRAY

As a family (household) cut hearts out of construction paper (or draw a heart on a blank piece of copy paper). Make a heart for each family member.

Write on your heart one or two things you want to ask Jesus to heal in your life or someone else's life (*I want to ask Jesus to heal my sadness or my worry or my fears*).

Gather around a prayer space with a candle or other object to focus on and lay the hearts around it. Begin your prayer with the sign of the cross and one by one each member of the household can read what they wrote on their heart. You can end your prayer by saying the Glory Be prayer together as a household.
