

THE DESTINY OF ALL MORTAL FLESH

The celebration of today's feast on a Sunday is unusual on our Roman Catholic calendar. Our observance of the Lord's Day is held in such high esteem that few other feasts replace it. Occasionally, there is a feast—usually of one of the Saints—in which the saving power of God in Christ is so uniquely focused that the Roman Rite deems it worthy of celebration on the Lord's Day. Today is such a feast. Yet some are surprised at the brevity of the dogma in its entirety: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The Roman Catholic Church never defined any specifics or particulars about the event itself. It is not in the scriptures. There are no verifiable eyewitness accounts. At its core, the dogma reveals in Mary the destiny of all mortal flesh, and reinforces our creedal belief in resurrection of the body. This feast strengthens our faith, defined last week in Hebrews as the realization of things hoped for. We find, in Mary, that realization of what we all hope for, what Paul today affirms: "In Christ shall all be brought to life" (1 Corinthians 15:22).

FACT OF LIFE

The spirit of these two athletes is even more inspirational than their impressive sporting abilities.

Being an Olympian demands focus, determination, and a competitive spirit, (along with all those athletic abilities)! Plus, representing your country is a lot of pressure. However, two athletes recently showed the world another quality that is definitely worth championing.

Qatar's Mutaz Essa Barshim and Italy's Gianmarco Tamberi were competing in the high jump on Sunday when they reached a stalemate. Both men had managed to jump over a staggering 2.37 meters with no faults along the way. However, after three attempts neither managed the next level of 2.39 meters.

An Olympic official suggested a jump off between the two friends and rivals to determine who would win the coveted gold medal. But Barshim had another plan to reward their efforts. "I look at him [Tamberi], he looks at me, and we know it. We just look at each other and we know, that is it, it is done. There is no need," he shared with the world's media, as reported by USA Today.

"Can we have two golds?" he asked the official. The official agreed and the two men jumped for joy, grabbing each other in jubilation, and in friendship. This was the first time a gold medal had been shared since 1912.

"He is one of my best friends, not only on the track, but outside the track. We work together. This is a dream come true. It is the true spirit, the sportsman spirit, and we are here delivering this message," shared Barshim, the joint gold medalist. www.aleteia.org


CONTINUING RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Continuing Education Class (Bible Study for children)

RETURNS SEPTEMBER 12, 2021. Did you know St. Anastasia's Parish has offered a children's bible study class for over 20 years—better known as "CHRIST'S LITTLE LAMBS." Eligible children must have received their first sacramental in school grades 3 -8.

The class is offered on Sundays, but it is not a substitute for Mass. Children should be participating in the mass with their parents and receiving the Sacrament of the Eucharist. The focus is for those children who do not attend a Catholic School and therefore are not receiving instruction in the Catholic faith. However, all children are welcome to attend.

The class is designed to enrich their knowledge of Scripture, through crafts, reading of the Gospel for that Sunday, reading biblical stories, and having discussions.
