Whom should we follow?

Today's Gospel is the conclusion of the Bread of Life disclosure in John. After Jesus' continued insistence that he is the Bread of Life come down from heaven, and that his words are "Spirit and life," most of his disciples drift away. The Twelve, however, affirm their faith in Jesus, who Simon Peter professes to "have the words of eternal life." In the first reading, Joshua and the Israelites are preparing to enter the Promised Land, and Joshua asks the people to decide which god they will follow., The Lord their God, or the gods of neighboring peoples. The Responsorial Psalm features Psalm 34, the "taste and see" psalm, that reflects the kinds of struggles the Israeilites face during their sojourn in the wilderness. In the second reading, Paul gives counsel for maintaining domestic peace and happiuness.

CROSSROADS IN LIFE, THEN AND NOW

Sometimes in life we find ourselves at a crossroads faced with an existential choice that will alter the course of our life. We are aware, at these moments, just how significant our choice will be and that there will be no going back.

In both the first reading and the Gospel we see such moments calling people to make such choices. Which god will the Israelites follow? Joshua, their leader after Moses, knows that the area around the Prmised Land is occupied by other peoples, with other gods. Perhaps remebering how, after Moses had gone up Mount Sinai, the Israelites set up a golden calf to worship, josua worries that they may again, be suceptible to such attractions. He is asking them for a commitment, and proclaims, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."

FACT OF LIFE

How a nonagenarian and a toddler became best friends in the pandemic The unlikely duo shows there's no age limit to friendship.

So many of us have spent the pandemic isolated from friends and family. In fact, two-year-old Benjamin Olson only had his immediate family for company, until he struck up a friendship with his 99-year-old neighbor.

The pair, who live in Minnesota, became friends over a period of time. The nonagenarian, Mary O'Neill, started out by waving to the toddler from her window. She then started going outside to say "hello." Soon the pair developed a close bond. "Benjamin keeps me company," shared O'Neill, who lost her husband 37 years ago. According to the senior, the pair will sit on a step and blow bubbles together when the weather allows. "Sometimes he'll get up and grab a piece of sand or a rock and give it to me as a gift. He makes me feel good," she explained.

The delightful friendship has brought so much to the pair. The duo created a new sport, Cane Ball, whereby Benjamin will kick a ball to Mary and she'll pass it back with her cane. The widow also gave to Benjamin a huge box of trucks that belonged to her late son, allowing the youngster to have fun and learn his colors. Benjamin's mom, Sarah, is also really touched by the pair's bond: "Mary is fiercely independent. She doesn't really show her cards. So I got really emotional when I heard her say that she missed Benjamin on the days when it was too cold or rainy to go outside," she shared. "Mary really is Benjamin's best friend," she added. "She's his first best friend."

Yet, perhaps most of all, the pair has taught us that friendship comes in so many shapes and forms. It just needs a little interest in those around us for it to flourish. And for little Benjamin, what a wonderful gift to have learned so early on in life. www.aleteia.org


CONTINUING RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Continuing Education Class (Bible Study for children)

RETURNS SEPTEMBER 12, 2021. Did you know St. Anastasia's Parish has offered a children's bible study class for over 20 years—better known as "CHRIST'S LITTLE LAMBS." Eligible children must have received their first sacramental in school grades 3 -8.

The class is offered on Sundays, but it is not a substitute for Mass. Children should be participating in the mass with their parents and receiving the Sacrament of the Eucharist. The focus is for those children who do not attend a Catholic School and therefore are not receiving instruction in the Catholic faith. However, all children are welcome to attend.

The class is designed to enrich their knowledge of Scripture, through crafts, reading of the Gospel for that Sunday, reading biblical stories, and having discussions.
